Fourteenth Session—Seventh Day.

Council.

Not in session to-day, but will have a session this evening.

House.

The house convened at 10 o'clock a. m., and opened with prayer by the chaplain.

The speaker was in the chair and the roll call showed all members in their seats.

The journal of the preceding session was read and approved.

NOTICE OF BILLS.

By Mr. Thorne—To legalize the acts of the president and trustees of the village of Dell Rapids, etc.

By Mr. Wells—An act to amend an act to amend chapter 13 of the political code.

By Mr. Hale—Exempting the counties of Lawrence, Pennington, Custer, Mandan and Forsyth from the provisions of certain sections of chapter 34 of the revised code.

By Mr. Dickey—To repair and amend certain sections of chapter 13 of the code of civil procedure.

By Mr. Nomland—To amend section 1, chapter 14, of the political code.

By Mr. Miller—Authorizing the commissioners of Richland county to bond the county for the purpose of raising money to build a court house and jail in said county.

INTRODUCTION OF BILLS.

By Mr. Baynes—To amend chapter 46 of the laws of 1879.

By Mr. Hall—An act exempting the counties of Lawrence, Custer, Pennington, Mandan and Forsyth from the provisions of chapter 33 of the code of civil procedure.

By Mr. Cross—For relief of the inhabitants of towns and cities on the public lands of the United States.

SECOND READING OF COUNCIL BILL.

Council Bill No. 7—A bill for an act to authorize the commissioners of Lincoln county to settle with their county treasurer.

Mr. Thompson moved an amendment which was carried and the bill was ordered printed and referred to the committee on counties and towns.

A motion to reconsider Mr. Thompson's amendment was carried.

Council Bill No. 8—A bill for an act to build and construct a jail for Lincoln county—read second time.

Moved by Mr. Wells and carried that the bill be referred to the committee on charitable and penal institutions.

HOUSE BILLS.

House bill No. 5—A bill for an act to construct a suitable court house and jail for Lawrence county, read a second time—Bill referred to a select committee composed of the members of the fifth district.

RECESS.

Moved and carried that the house take a recess of ten minutes.

After recess Mr. Landman's absence of Saturday was excused, on motion of Mr. Dickey.

Moved by Mr. Baynes and carried that the house adjourn.
