Was read the first time and referred to the committee on State and Federal Government.

FIRST READING OF HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION Reps. Eagles and Horgan introduced:

House Concurrent Resolution No. 3019. — A concurrent resolution recognizing the North Dakota State Insect Reference Collection.

Which was read the first time.

Rep. Strinden moved that the rules be suspended, that House Concurrent Resolution No. 3019 not be referred to committee, be read in its entirety, not printed as a bill but printed in the journal, and placed on second reading and final passage, which motion prevailed.

A concurrent resolution recognizing the North Dakota State

Insect Reference Collection.

WHEREAS, the insect collection maintained by the Entomology Department at North Dakota State University has grown since its establishment in 1890 to include over 315,000 specimens valued at approximately one million dollars; and

WHEREAS, the collection is the only comprehensive resource of its kind in the State of North Dakota; and

WHEREAS, the collection has great historical and scientific importance for teaching, research, and extension activities throughout the State of North Dakota;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Entomology Department at North Dakota State University be commended for its sustained and diligent efforts over the last ninety years to develop this valuable reference collection for the State of North Dakota; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Department's collection be hereafter designated as "The North Dakota State Insect Reference Collection"; and

agencies with entomological interests are hereby encouraged to

utilize the North Dakota State Reference Collection and to

enhance it by contributing additional specimens no longer

needed for their own activities.

The question being on the final adoption of the resolution.
