Speaker Peterson appointed Reps. Haugland and Solberg to such committee, which subsequently escorted the Honorable Morris MacGregor to the podium.

Rep. Solberg moved that the remarks of the Honorable Morris MacGregor be printed in the Journal, which motion prevailed.

Mr. MacGregor: "Mr. Speaker Peterson, whom I consider an old friend, and members of the North Dakota Legislature: I have had the privilege many times of serving further than the boundaries of Manitoba. I had the privilege some two years ago to be in Madrid. I met your Ambassador to Spain, Torrence Todman, a real fine diplomat of the finest tune. I also met my Canadian Ambassador, and later on, I met Ken Taylor, who is at least a casual friend of mine, and his actions out of Iran will be known by all of you. I know if anything tied our two nations together, the acts of Ken Taylor as Canadian Ambassador did

I look at the audience and I see my friend Oscar and a lady that serves on the Peace Gardens, Mr. Speaker, with yourself and many other members, and I think of her rather casually, and I used to refer to Rep. Haugland as the 'Minot brainchild'. I am not sure that she liked me for those remarks, and to have her sitting with my President, Alf Heritage, is an honor. And isn't it, indeed, heritage that we are all about?

So I just say to you, coming here in the footsteps of my late colleague Earl Mc Keller, whom Oscar and many of you connected with the Peace Gardens knew, this is an honor. Many of you know the great personal affection that Earl carried, not only in Manitoba, but down here in North Dakota, or, indeed, anywhere where Earl went.

I am grateful indeed to have the privilege of standing in this democratic symbol of freedom and to bring you greetings from one free country to another, across an undefended border.

And yesterday, on the T.V. screens was something that I as a Canadian felt close to. We can always become political, but to see the

action was something. How many of you and I would have said, 'Get the bomb out; bring those fifty-two hostages home.' The President then took the quiet route and we saw it at 2:00 a.m. in my hotel room in Bismarck. When I saw those people come off the airplane in that particular place in Germany, I thought which route is the best. You know we have to think of that many times as two nations. We are not always in complete agreement, but I really think that was an example of quiet, steady judgement, and I am sure there will be yeas and nays on that one, but that was my keen appreciation.

I think it appropriate that my visit here is associated with another symbol of enduring friendship, The International Peace Garden. As you know, we are preparing for the celebration of the 50th anniversary of this garden, next year, the summer of 1982. I can think of no more moving expression, both of the garden and our friendship - than the words on the cairn at the entrance to our joint peace garden:

'To God in His Glory we two nations dedicate this garden and pledge ourselves that as long as men shall live, we will not take up arms against one another.'

For us, it is more than a garden. For us, it represents a mature and solid friendship. We have more than a common border. We have a common language and a common heritage and our boundary is just a political description, rather than a geographic barrier.

Both of us know that we have our differences as well. But the point is, we have institutions that are formalized by law and cemented by mutual esteem that are designed to help us resolve these differences.

I think it appropriate that our common garden has been used as a site for joint receptions involving members of the state legislature and my own provincial legislature, including many other Canadians and Americans.

May our friendship, our mutual friendship, flourish like our mutual garden.

In closing, Mr. Speaker, may I extend through you, an invitation to members of both Houses to be guests of the Manitoba Legislature when our House Assembly is in session.

We re-open on February 3, 1981, and will be sitting until late June or July. We would certainly be pleased to have the opportunity to reciprocate the genuine hospitality shown to Alf and myself this afternoon, and to Earl Mc Keller and his colleagues who have come down here some years ago. Thank you Mr. Speaker."
