POINT OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

Rep. Meiers: I rise on a point of personal privilege and ask that my remarks be placed in the Journal: "Mr. Speaker, fellow legislators: This is a 'first' for the 47th Legislative Assembly — the first time a legislator has been denied the privilege of withdrawing a bill which has been introduced. Many bills have been withdrawn previously, all of

them considered by their sponsors to have merit. For instance, House Bill No. 1329 was withdrawn last Friday without objection.

House Bill No. 1649 is a companion bill in that it deals with the same subject matter. When one was allowed to be withdrawn, the same courtesy should be extended to the other. The usual procedure would have been to assign both bills to the same committee, have them considered according to their merits and then make a recommendation. It is interesting to note that House Bill No. 1329 introduced earlier had not yet been scheduled for a hearing prior to withdrawal, but House Bill No. 1649, introduced much later, is scheduled for a hearing on Tuesday according to the media. The scenario for House Bill No. 1649 was graphically described on statewide television this past weekend. It it destined to become a duplicate of House Bill No. 1329. The stage has been set; the actors have been assigned their roles and the show will go on. Fair play does not have to be one of the ingredients in this worthwhile purpose. The best interest of this Legislative Assembly, the best interest of the people of this state would now have been to allow this bill to die a natural death. To proceed diminishes us all!"

State Historical Board

The salaries and wages line item of the State Historical Board is reduced by \$24,411 by adding \$72,310 which will allow funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium; by subtracting \$15,692 to correct the executive budget calculation; and by subtracting \$81,629 to delete the two positions of a volunteer services coordinator and an education division director. The salaries and wages line item amount of \$2,176,366 includes \$66,960 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees.

The operating expense line item is reduced by \$7,389 and the equipment line item is reduced by \$9,240 for the two positions deleted.

The amount of \$419,745 in federal funds in the capital improvements line item is deleted because federal funds are not available; and \$25,000 from the general fund is added for road preparation and to activate the water treatment plant in the spring of 1981. The grants, benefits, and claims line item is increased by \$27,000 for general maintenance of the gardens.

The operating expenses and the equipment line items are increased a total of \$136,118, of which \$128,118 in operating expenses is for contracting services for additional promotions, and the remaining \$8,000 is for equipment purchases. This \$136,118 is due to increased revenues available to the Sunflower Council.

State Seed Department

Salaries and wages of the State Seed Department are increased by \$72,232 which will allow funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. The salaries and wages line item amount of \$1,845,255 includes \$54,353 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees.

Agricultural Products Promotion Commission

Salaries and wages of the Agricultural Products Promotion Commission are increased by \$3,637 which will allow funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increases and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. The salaries and wages line item amount of \$104,839 includes \$3,416 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees.

State_Wheat Commission

Salaries and wages of the State Wheat Commission are increased by \$18,644 which will allow funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. The salaries and wages line item amount of \$427,140 includes \$13,123 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees.

Predatory Animal Control

Salaries and wages for Predatory Animal Control are increased by \$17,786 which will allow funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium.

House Concurrent Resolution No. 3045. — A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to conduct a study of state laws governing the possession, sale, and use of weapons.

Which was read the first time, and referred to the committee on Natural Resources.

FIRST READING OF SENATE BILLS

Senate Bill No. 2034. — A Bill for an Act making an appropriation for defraying the administrative expenses of the public employees retirement system and the group insurance program of the state of North Dakota.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

Senate Bill No. 2035. — A Bill for an Act making an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the teachers' fund for retirement of the state of North Dakota.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

Senate Bill No. 2149. — A Bill for an Act to provide for a program to regulate hazardous waste from the point of generation through transportation, storage, treatment and disposal, a permit and manifest system, and a demonstration of financial responsibility; and to provide a penalty.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Social Services and Veterans Affairs.

Senate Bill No. 2167. — A Bill for an Act to create and enact nine new paragraphs to subdivision a of subsection 3 of section 39-06.1-10 and two new paragraphs to subdivision b of subsection 3 of section 39-06.1-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to point assessments for snowmobile violations; to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section

39-06-35, section 39-06-43, paragraph 26 of subdivision a of subsection 3 of section 39-06.1-10, and sections 39-06.1-12 and 39-08-09 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to periods of driver's license suspension, extension of driver's license suspension, points for driving without a license, reduction of point assessments, and accident reports; and to repeal subsection 3 of section 39-08-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to revocation of license for conviction of leaving the scene of an accident.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

Senate Bill No. 2179. — A Bill for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 39-10-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to use of amber lights by class A emergency vehicles; to amend and reenact section 39-06.1-09, paragraph 14 of subdivision a of subsection 3 of section 39-06.1-10, subsection 1 of section 39-08-03.1, and subsection 2 of section 39-24-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, defining moving violations to include motorcyle violations, point assessments for racing, exhibition driving and snowmobile regulations; and to repeal section 39-10-70 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to racing of vehicles.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

Senate Bill No. 2183. — A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact sections 24-01-37, 24-02-17, and 24-08-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the time period for inspection of bridges by the state highway department and the counties, the maximum dollar amount allowed for the awarding of contracts by the state highway department without advertising for bids.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

Senate Bill No. 2207. — A Bill for an Act to direct the adjutant general to compile, publish, and distribute a history of the North Dakota army national guard and the 164th infantry regiment; and to provide an appropriation.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Federal Government.

Senate Bill No. 2266. — A Bill for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 49-18-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition of corporate family and a new subsection to section 49-18-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to inapplicability of provisions of law to intercorporate hauling.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Industry, Business and Labor.

Senate Bill No. 2300. — A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact section 16.1-03-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the time and manner for holding a precinct caucus to elect precinct committeemen; and declaring an emergency.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Senate Bill No. 2305. — A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact section 2 of chapter 212 of the 1979 Session Laws of North Dakota, relating to the use of property deeded by the state board of higher education to the United States department of agriculture human nutrition laboratory.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Federal Government.

Senate Bill No. 2328. — A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact section 18-01-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the appointment of the fire marshal.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Federal Government.
