




The amounts referred to in this section shall not be used for any purpose other than to fund noncontributory retirement programs for state employees. If the forty-seventh legislative assembly does not provide by statute for non-contributory retirement programs for state employees, such amounts shall remain in each salary and wages line item until such line item is canceled on July 30, 1983."

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

Salaries and wages of the Bonding Fund are increased by \$1,632 to provide funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium with funds for fringe benefits including \$2,519 for the state funding of the employees' share of PERS.

Salaries and wages of the Fire and Tornado Fund are increased by \$6,505 to provide funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium with funds for fringe benefits including \$10,396 for the state funding of the employees' share of PERS.



BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 11-17-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

11-17-04. FEES TO BE CHARGED BY THE CLERK OF THE DISTRICT COURT. The clerk of the district court shall charge and collect the following fees:

1. For the filing of an action, including an action transferred from another county, and for all things in connection therewith which are not hereinafter provided for, fifteen dollars.
2. For issuing a regular or special execution in an action, two dollars.

3. For filing a regular or special execution on return, one dollar.
4. For filing and indexing a mechanic's lien, two dollars.
5. For filing and indexing any paper authorized to be filed in his office but not connected with a civil action or proceeding, one dollar.
6. For making a certified abstract or exemplified copy of a judgment or a certified or exemplified copy of judgment, order, or other paper filed or recorded in his office, for the first four pages, one dollar, and for each additional page, fifty cents.
7. ~~For approving the bond of a notary public, one dollar.~~
8. For entering and indexing the commission of a notary public, one dollar.
9. For taking an acknowledgment or administering an oath, one dollar.
10. For recording and indexing any paper not filed in an action or proceeding, for the first four pages, one dollar, and for each additional page, fifty cents.
11. For a certificate of official capacity of a notary public or other officer, one dollar.
12. For certifying an abstract of real property as to judgments and liens, for each person named in the abstract as to whom search is made, one dollar.
13. For issuing a commission to take depositions, two dollars.
14. For certifying the record on appeal to the supreme court or to the district court of any other county and transmitting the same, ten dollars.
15. For all services on remittitur from supreme court, five dollars.
16. For taking depositions, for each page, one dollar.
17. For making a certified transcript of any judgment, two dollars.
18. For filing and docketing a transcript of a judgment from a justice's court or from any other county, two dollars.
19. For filing and entering an affidavit and other papers for the renewal of a judgment, two dollars.
20. For registering and filing a certificate of partnership, ten dollars.
21. For all services in adoption proceedings, five dollars.
22. For all services in proceedings for deposit in court, five dollars.
23. For filing and indexing the notice of intent to file a mechanic's lien pursuant to section 35-27-12, two dollars.

- 24- 23. For issuing an identification card, three dollars.
- 25- 24. For filing a hospital lien, two dollars.
- 26- 25. For filing a satisfaction of judgment, one dollar.
- 27- 26. For preparing a subpoena, one dollar.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 44-06-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

44-06-03. OATH AND BOND OF NOTARY PUBLIC --APPROVAL-OF-BOND. Each notary public, before entering upon the duties of his office, shall take the oath prescribed for civil officers and give to the state a bond in the penal sum of five hundred dollars conditioned for the faithful discharge of the duties of his office. Such bond may be furnished by a surety or bonding company authorized to do business in this state or by one or more sureties, and shall be subject to approval as follows:

- 1. If it is a surety bond, it shall be subject to approval by the secretary of state, and such approval shall be without charge.
- 2. If it is a personal bond, it shall be subject to approval by the clerk of the district court of the county of which the notary public is a resident, or of the county to which such county is attached for judicial purposes.

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 44-06-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

44-06-04. FILING OF OATH, BOND, AND IMPRESSION OF NOTARIAL SEAL. Each notary public, before entering upon the duties of such office, shall provide himself with an official seal bearing his name and shall:

- 1. Deposit a legible impression of such seal, together with his oath and bond, in the office of the secretary of state, and
- 2. File his commission for record in the office of the clerk of the district court of the county of which he is a resident and deposit with such clerk an impression of his seal together with his official signature. The clerk shall record such information in a book to be kept for that purpose, and the person complying with the provisions of this subsection is a notary public during the time the commission is in force."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. SCHOOL ADMINISTRATOR - DEFINITION. A "school administrator", as used in sections 2 through 6 of this Act, means a public school employee who devotes at least fifty percent of the employee's time to administration of the school or schools of a school district.

SECTION 2. DISMISSAL OF SCHOOL ADMINISTRATOR. A school board may dismiss a school administrator if it:

1. Evaluated the administrator, pursuant to section 4 of this Act;
2. Substantiates the reasons for dismissal through a hearing, pursuant to section 5 of this Act; and
3. Grants the administrator severance pay, pursuant to section 6 of this Act.

SECTION 3. NONRENEWAL OF SCHOOL ADMINISTRATOR'S CONTRACT. A school board may nonrenew a school administrator's contract if it:

1. Evaluated the administrator, pursuant to section 4 of this Act;
2. Provided the administrator with notice of intent to nonrenew the administrator's contract at least six months prior to the expiration of the administrator's initial contract or at least one year prior to subsequent contracts.
3. Substantiates the reasons for dismissal through a hearing, pursuant to section 5 of this Act; and
4. Grants the administrator severance pay, pursuant to section 6 of this Act.

A school administrator's contract shall be automatically renewed on identical terms as the precedent contract unless a school board renews or renegotiates the contract and retains the administrator or satisfies all of the requirements contained in this section for nonrenewal of a contract.

SECTION 4. EVALUATIONS OF SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION. A school board shall evaluate a school administrator's job performance and communicate the results to the administrator at least once a year and at least six months prior to the expiration of the administrator's contract. Provided, a board may dismiss an administrator for dishonesty, misappropriation of funds, fraud, conviction of a felony, or immoral conduct at any time without having evaluated the administrator pursuant to this section.

SECTION 5. HEARING ON DISMISSAL OR NONRENEWAL.

1. A school board shall substantiate the reasons for dismissal of a school administrator or nonrenewal of the administrator's contract through a hearing held before dismissal or nonrenewal. The board shall provide the administrator with written notice of the hearing and the alleged reasons for dismissal or nonrenewal at least ten days before the hearing. At the hearing, the administrator shall have the right to:
 - a. Be heard in person and present witnesses and documentary evidence;
 - b. Confront and cross-examine adverse witnesses, unless the board determines that the confrontation would create a risk of harm to the witness; and
 - c. A written statement as to the reasons for dismissal or nonrenewal.
2. The hearing may, at the request of either party, be transcribed by a court reporter at the expense of the person requesting the transcript.
3. The hearing shall be held in executive session unless the board and administrator agree that it shall be open to other persons or the public.
4. All records of the hearing shall be confidential unless:
 - a. The board and administrator agree that they shall be open to the public; or
 - b. The board substantiates the reasons for dismissal or nonrenewal at the hearing and dismisses the administrator or does not renew the administrator's contract.
5. No cause of action for libel or slander shall lie for any statement expressed orally or in writing at the hearing.

SECTION 6. SEVERANCE PAY ON DISMISSAL OR NONRENEWAL. A school board shall pay a school administrator immediately after dismissal or nonrenewal severance pay which equals fifty percent of the administrator's annual salary as of the time of dismissal or nonrenewal. Provided a school board may not pay a school administrator severance pay if the school board met either or both of the following conditions:

1. Provided the administrator with notice of its intention to dismiss the administrator or not to renew the administrator's contract at least six months prior to the expiration of the administrator's initial contract or at least one year prior to subsequent contracts;
2. Dismissed the administrator for dishonesty, misappropriation of funds, fraud, conviction of a felony, or immoral conduct.

SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 15-29-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

15-29-10. DISTRICT RECORDS OPEN TO EXAMINATION - RECORDS AS EVIDENCE. The records, books, vouchers, and papers of the district shall be open to examination by any taxpayer of the district. Such Provided, all records

of a hearing held prior to dismissal of a school administrator or nonrenewal of an administrator's contract shall be confidential to the extent provided under section 5 of this Act. The records, or a transcript thereof certified by the clerk shall be received in all courts as prima facie evidence of the facts therein set forth.

SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 15-47-26 of the 1977 Pocket Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

15-47-26. DEFINITIONS.--The term "teacher", as used in sections 15-47-27 and 15-47-28, shall be construed to include all teachers, principals, and superintendents in all public school districts within this state, and all persons employed in teaching in any state institution, except institutions of higher education.--The term "teacher", as used in section 15-47-29, shall be construed to include all teachers and principals in all public school districts within this state, and all persons employed in teaching in any state institution, except institutions of higher learning.
TEACHER - DEFINITION. A "teacher", as used in sections 15-47-27, 15-47-28, and 15-47-38, means:

1. A teacher who devotes less than fifty percent of the teacher's time during employment to administration of the school or schools of a school district; and
2. A teacher in a state institution, except institutions of higher learning."
