BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. SCHOOL ADMINISTRATOR - DEFINITION. A "school administrator", as used in sections 2 through 6 of this Act, means a public school employee who devotes at least fifty percent of the employee's time to administration of the school or schools of a school district.

SECTION 2. DISMISSAL OF SCHOOL ADMINISTRATOR. A school board may dismiss a school administrator if it:

- Evaluated the administrator, pursuant to section 4 of this Act;
- Substantiates the reasons for dismissal through <u>a hearing</u>, pursuant to section 5 of this Act; and
- Grants the administrator severance pay, pursuant to section 6 of this Act.

SECTION 3. NONRENEWAL OF SCHOOL ADMINISTRATOR'S CONTRACT. A school board may nonrenew a school administrator's contract if it:

- Evaluated the administrator, pursuant to section 4 of this Act;
- 2. Provided the administrator with notice of intent to nonrenew the administrator's contract at least six months prior to the expiration of the administrator's initial contract or at least one year prior to subsequent contracts.
- Substantiates the reasons for dismissal through a hearing, pursuant to section 5 of this Act; and
- 4. Grants the administrator severance pay, pursuant to section 6 of this Act.

A school administrator's contract shall be automatically renewed on identical terms as the precedent contract unless a school board renews or renegotiates the contract and retains the administrator or satisfies all of the requirements contained in this section for nonrenewal of a contract.

SECTION 4. EVALUATIONS OF SCHOOL ADMINISTRATION.
A school board shall evaluate a school administrator's job performance and communicate the results to the administrator at least once a year and at least six months prior to the expiration of the administrator's contract. Provided, a board may dismiss an administrator for dishonesty, misappropriation of funds, fraud, conviction of a felony, or immoral conduct at any time without having evaluated the administrator pursuant to this section.

SECTION 5. HEARING ON DISMISSAL OR NONRENEWAL.

- A school board shall substantiate the reasons for dismissal of a school administrator or nonrenewal of the administrator's contract through a hearing held before dismissal or nonrenewal. The board shall provide the administrator with written notice of the hearing and the alleged reasons for dismissal or nonrenewal at least ten days before the hearing. At the hearing, the administrator shall have the right to:
  - a. Be heard in person and present witnesses and documentary evidence;
  - b. Confront and cross-examine adverse witnesses, unless the board determines that the confrontation would create a risk of harm to the witness; and
  - c. A written statement as to the reasons for dismissal or nonrenewal.
- The hearing may, at the request of either party, be transcribed by a court reporter at the expense of the person requesting the transcript.
- The hearing shall be held in executive session unless the board and administrator agree that it shall be open to other persons or the public.
- 4. All records of the hearing shall be confidential unless:
  - a. The board and administrator agree that they shall be open to the public; or
  - b. The board substantiates the reasons for dismissal or nonrenewal at the hearing and dismisses the administrator or does not renew the administrator's contract.
- No cause of action for libel or slander shall lie for any statement expressed orally or in writing at the hearing.
- SECTION 6. SEVERANCE PAY ON DISMISSAL OR NONRENEWAL. A school board shall pay a school administrator immediately after dismissal or nonrenewal severance pay which equals fifty percent of the administrator's annual salary as of the time of dismissal or nonrenewal. Provided a school board may not pay a school administrator severance pay if the school board met either or both of the following conditions:
  - Provided the administrator with notice of its intention to dismiss the administrator or not to renew the administrator's contract at least six months prior to the expiration of the administrator's initial contract or at least one year prior to subsequent contracts;
  - pismissed the administrator for dishonesty, misappropriation of funds, fraud, conviction of a felony, or immoral conduct.

SECTION 7. AMENDMENT. Section 15-29-10 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

15-29-10. DISTRICT RECORDS OPEN TO EXAMINATION - RECORDS AS EVIDENCE. The records, books, vouchers, and papers of the district shall be open to examination by any taxpayer of the district. Such Provided, all records

of a hearing held prior to dismissal of a school administrator or nonrenewal of an administrator's contract shall be confidential to the extent provided under section 5 of this Act. The records, or a transcript thereof certified by the clerk shall be received in all courts as prima facie evidence of the facts therein set forth.

SECTION 8. AMENDMENT. Section 15-47-26 of the 1977 Pocket Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

15-47-26. DEFINITIONS --- The-term-"teacher" -- as used-in-sections-15-47-27-and-15-47-287-shall-be construed-to-include-all-teachers,-principals,-and superintendents-in-all-public-school-districts-within this-state;-and-all-persons-employed-in-teaching-in-any state-institution,-except-institutions-of-higher education -- The-term-"teacher" -- as-used-in-section 15-47-387-shall-be-construed-to-include-all-teachers-and principals-in-all-public-school-districts-within-this state--and-all-persons-employed-in-teaching-in-any-state institution, -except-institutions-of-higher-learning, TEACHER - DEFINITION. A "teacher", as used in sections 15-47-27, 15-47-28, and 15-47-38, means:

- 1. A teacher who devotes less than fifty percent of the teacher's time during employment to administration of the school or schools of a school district; and
- A teacher in a state institution, except institutions of higher learning.
