
House Bill No. 1546. — A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact

agency named in this Act §814 is included in the salaries and wages line item to fund a noncontributory employee retirement plan. The amount referred to in this section shall not be used for any purpose other than to fund a noncontributory retirement program for state employees. If the forty-seventh legislative assembly does not provide by statute for a non-contributory retirement program for state employees, such amounts shall remain in the salaries and wages line item until such line item is canceled on July 30, 1983."

And when so amended, recommends the same do pass.

Statement of the Purpose of the Amendment:

Salaries and wages of the Civil Air Patrol are decreased by \$1,645 which will allow funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. The salaries and wages line item amount of \$26,453 includes §814 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees.


