STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

School for the Deaf

Salaries and wages of the School for the Deaf are increased by \$110,686 to provide funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. The salaries and wages line item amount of \$2,751,510 includes \$88,998 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees. Operating expenses are reduced by \$8,318 to reflect legislative guidelines of nine percent per year. Estimated income is increased \$70,300 to reflect revised estimates of funds to be distributed from the State Land Department interest and income account.

School for the Blind

Salaries and wages of the School for the Blind are increased by \$51,707 to provide funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. Salaries and wages are also increased by \$6,591 to allow a .835 FTE instructor to be adjusted to a 1.0 FTE instructor. The salaries and wages line item amount of \$1,538,440 includes \$47,476 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees. Operating expenses are reduced by \$3,021 to reflect legislative guidelines of nine percent per year. Estimated income is increased \$76,200 to reflect revised estimates of funds to be distributed from the State Land Department interest and income account.

Capital improvements and estimated income from the Vietnam bonus fund are reduced by \$527,931 to reflect current cost projections for renovating the boiler plant and heating system which is projected to cost \$422,069.

Estimated income is reduced by \$449,908. This amount is arrived at by subtracting \$527,931 to reflect current cost projections of renovating the boiler plant; by adding \$64,504 to reflect the revised estimate of funds to be distributed from the Land Department's interest and income account; by adding \$9,941 to reflect the estimate of Veterans' Administration funds to be received based on an occupancy rate of 118 residents; and by adding \$3,578 to reflect current estimates of miscellaneous revenues.

The state shall retain a concurrent jurisdiction with the United States in and over lands so acquired to the extent that civil process in all cases, and such criminal process as may issue under the authority of the state against any person charged with the commission of any crime without or within said jurisdiction, may be executed thereon in like manner as if this section had not been enacted. The legislative consent required by this section shall be in the form of a duly enacted bill.
