#### STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

#### Governor's Office

Salaries and wages of the Governor's office are increased by \$89,867 to provide funds for an additional position. The addition of this attorney, who is presently chairing the Natural Resources Council, to the Governor's office is related to the discontinuance of a separate appropriation for the Natural Resources Council. The salaries and wages line item amount of \$831,000 includes \$27,798 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees. The operating expenses line item is increased by \$44,000 to allow those operating expenses relating to the additional position.

#### Lieutenant Governor

Salaries and wages of the Lieutenant Governor are increased by \$7,051 to allow funding for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. The salaries and wages line item of \$53,054 includes \$3,725 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees.

#### Secretary of State

Salaries and wages of the Secretary of State are increased by \$31,521 to provide funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium with funds for fringe benefits including \$23,138 for the state funding of the employees' share of PERS. The salaries and wages line item of the Secretary of State is also increased by \$21,701 to provide funds for an additional clerk-typist.

Salaries and wages of the Secretary of State - Records Management and Microfilming are increased by \$7,931 to provide funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium with funds for fringe benefits including \$4,996 for the state funding of the employees' share of PERS.

## Attorney General

The salaries and wages of the Attorney General's office are increased by \$473,813. This amount is arrived at by adding \$166,352 to provide funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. In addition, \$307,461 is included for the transfer of the salaries and wages of 5.5 FTE from the Law Enforcement Council, which will provide funds for the establishment of a Law Enforcement Training and Statistics Division in the Attorney General's office as proposed in House Bill No. 1509. The salaries and wages line item of \$3,694,674 includes \$122,266 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees.

The operating expenses line item is increased by \$358,260. The amount is arrived at by adding \$50,000 to increase the Drug Enforcement Unit's investigative fund to \$150,000, and by adding \$308,260 for the operating expenses relating to the Law Enforcement Council.

The data processing line item is increased by \$21,689 for the data processing expenses relating to the Law Enforcement Council.

The equipment line item is increased by \$2,500 for the equipment relating to the Law Enforcement Council.

A grants line item of \$747,000 is added for the grants relating

to the Law Enforcement Council.

The estimated income line item is increased by \$730,000 to reflect the LEAA grants relating to the Law Enforcement Council.

#### State Auditor

Salaries and wages of the State Auditor's office are increased by \$148,867 which will allows funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. The salaries and wages line item amount of \$2,498,985 includes \$82,706 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees.

#### State Treasurer

Salaries and wages of the State Treasurer are increased by \$30,368 to allow funding for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. The salaries and wages line item of \$459,310 includes \$14,885 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees.

#### Tax Commissioner

Salaries and wages of the State Tax Commissioner are increased by \$266,541 to allow funding for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. Also, salaries and wages are reduced by \$179,633, operating expenses by \$85,853, and equipment by \$4,040 to delete funds for the requested 4.0 FTE new positions associated expenses which were approved by the executive budget. The positions deleted are 3.0 FTE tax auditors in the Sales and Special Taxes Division, .5 FTE industrial appraiser in the Property and Utility Tax Division, and .5 FTE industrial appraiser for the State Board of Equalization. Funds in the amount of \$53,020 are allowed in the State Board of Equalization program for the purpose of payment of professional fees. The salaries and wages line item of \$5,567,380 includes \$167,756 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees.

#### Insurance Commissioner

Salaries and wages of the Insurance Commissioner are increased by \$121,276 to adjust salaries for current employees, to provide for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase where applicable, and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium with funds for fringe benefits including \$30,024 for the state funding of the employees' share of PERS. Also, a professional government intern and administrator position were upgraded to actuary positions. Salaries and wages are also increased by \$94,029 for two new positions, a public information officer and a policyholder claims investigator. Salaries and wages are decreased by \$17,690 for temporary salaries which are deleted. Therefore, the total salary line item is increased by \$197,615.

The amendment also increases the operating expenses line by \$19,120 for additional travel.

#### Labor Commissioner

Salaries and wages for the Labor Commissioner are increased by \$16,182 from the general fund to provide funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium with funds for fringe benefits. Salaries and wages include \$11,234 of fringe benefits to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan. Operating expenses and estimated income are increased by \$4,357 of federal funds to be used to investigate employment discrimination cases prior to July 1, 1981.

#### Public Service Commission

Salaries and wages of the Public Service Commission are increased by \$138,427, of which \$69,213 is from federal funds and \$69,214 is from the general fund, to allow funding for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. The salaries and wages line item of \$3,359,822 includes \$106,135 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees.

#### Agriculture Commissioner

The salaries and wages line item of the Agriculture Commissioner is increased by \$72,541 which will allows funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. The salaries and wages line item amount of \$1,526,375 includes \$48,882 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees.

The estimated income line item is reduced \$137,149. This reduction is arrived at by adding \$5,011 for the adjustment to the salary line item; and by subtracting \$142,160 of federal funds for a research analyst and marketing specialist since this amount is being added to the general fund appropriation.

#### Director of Institutions

Salaries and wages of the Director of Institutions are increased by \$84,102 to provide funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. Salaries and wages are also increased by \$25,289 to provide funds for a current .5 FTE employee to be changed to a 1.0 FTE Administrative Officer I. (This position is for a full-time assistant to serve as the Governor's residence coordinator.) The salaries and wages line item amount of \$2,902,188 includes \$86,110 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees. Operating expenses are increased by \$273,000 due to estimated increases in electrical consumption, and decreased by \$271,620 to delete funds for space rental for the judicial wing and state office building. Rental funds will not be necessary as these amendments provide for transfer of title of the building to the state. The capital improvements line item is increased a total of \$237,300, of which \$46,300 is for furnishings and repairs to the Governor's residence and \$191,000 is for Capitol renovation.

The new special education contingency fund line item provides \$300,000 to be used by the state-operated schools under the control of the Director of Institutions for expenses incurred for services to handicapped individuals which are not provided for in the normal budget of the schools.

The new section regarding the judicial wing and state office building appropriates \$11,750,000 from the lands and minerals trust fund to the permanent fund of the common schools for transfer of title of the building to the state.

## BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 61-01-22 of the 1979 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

61-01-22. PERMIT TO DRAIN WATERS REQUIRED - PENALTY. Any person, before draining water from a pond, slough, or lake, or any series thereof, which drains an area comprising eighty acres [32.37 hectares] or more into-a-watercourse; as-defined-by-section-61-01-06, shall first secure a permit to do so. The permit application shall be submitted to the state engineer. After receipt, the state engineer shall consider the application in such detail as he deems necessary and proper. The state engineer shall refer the application to the board of-commissioners-of-the water management resource district or-districts within which is found a majority of the watershed or-drainage-area-of-the-pond; slough;-or-lake for their consideration and appreval; but decision. However, the state engineer may

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require that applications proposing drainage of statewide or interdistrict significance be returned to him for final approval. A permit shall not be granted until **an**:

- 1. an An investigation shall disclose that the quantity of water which will be drained from the pondy sloughy-or-lakey-or-any-stries-thereof- will not flood or adversely affect lands or property of lower-proprietors other landowners. If the investigation shall-show shows that the proposed drainage will flood or adversely affect lands of-lower or property of other landowners, the baard of commissioners of-the-water-management-fistriet a permit shall not issue-a-permit be issued until flowage easements are obtained. Such flowage easements shall be filed for record in the office of the register of deeds of the county or counties in which such lands are situated. An owner of land proposing to drain shall undertake and agree to pay the expenses incurred in making the required investigation.
- The state water resources policy as set forth in section 61-01-26 has been duly considered.
- 3. Appropriate controls or other such devices shall be installed, operated, and maintained by the owner of the drain in accordance with a plan approved by the appropriate water resource district.

The provisions of this section shall not be-construedto apply to the construction or maintenance of any existing or prospective drain constructed under the supervision of a state or federal agency, as determined by the state engineer, or to any drain constructed prior to 1975. Any person draining, or causing to be drained, water of a pond, slough, or lake, or any series thereof, which drains an area comprising eighty acres [32.37 hectares] or more, into-a-watercourser without-first-securing-a-permit-to-do-ser-as-provided-by in violation of this section, shall be liable for all damage sustained by any person caused by such draining, drainage

- 2. The governor's council on human resources as established by chapter 50-26.
- 3. The mental health and retardation division of

the department of health as established by chapter 25-10, including the state hospital and any other institutions under the jurisdiction of the mental health and retardation division.

- The division of alcoholism and drug abuse of the department of health as established by chapter 54-38.
- 5. The state council on developmental disabilities as established by section 25-01-01.1.

SECTION 2. EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR - APPOINTMENT -COMPENSATION. The executive director of the department of human services shall be appointed by, and shall serve at the pleasure of, the governor. The executive director shall take the oath of office required of civil officers by section 44-01-05 and shall be bonded as required of civil officers by section 44-01-06. The executive director shall receive compensation in the amount established by the governor within the limits of legislative appropriations.

SECTION 3. STRUCTURE OF THE DEPARTMENT. The department of human services shall include an office of human services, an office of economic assistance and county administration, administrative and fiscal support services as the executive director deems necessary, and as many other subdivisions as the executive director may deem appropriate, or as may be provided by law.

- The office of human services shall contain the following divisions:
  - a. Developmental disabilities division.
  - b. Mental health and alcoholism and drug abuse division, including the state hospital.
  - c. Social services division, including an aging services unit and a children and family services unit.
  - d. Vocational rehabilitation division, including regional vocational rehabilitation offices collocated with regional human service centers.
- The office of economic assistance and county administration shall include the following divisions:
  - <u>a.</u> Public assistance division, including a food stamp unit, a housing assistance unit, an assistance payments unit, an energy assistance unit, and a child support unit.
  - b. Medical assistance division.

Regional supervisors of economic assistance shall be collocated with regional human service centers and shall be responsible for maintaining a close working relationship between county social service boards and regional human service centers. The executive director of the department of human services shall be responsible for consulting with and maintaining a close working relationship with the department of health; with the director of institutions and the superintendents of the Grafton state school, the school for the deaf, and the school for the blind to develop programs for developmentally disabled persons; and with the superintendent of public instruction to maximize the use of resource persons in regional human service centers in the provision of special education services. SECTION 4. REGIONAL HUMAN SERVICE CENTERS -LICENSURE - COLLOCATION WITH COUNTY SOCIAL SERVICE BOARDS. Human services shall be delivered through regional human service centers in the areas designated by the governor's executive order 49 dated September 18, 1969. Services provided by regional human service centers shall include those services formerly provided by mental health and retardation service units and area social service centers. The regional human service centers shall be subject to licensing by the state department of human services. The department shall adopt rules and standards for the licensing and operation of the regional human service centers. No human service center may operate without a license issued hereunder. Regional human service centers are authorized to receive federal and other funds available to finance, in whole or in part, the services board collocating its offices with a regional human service center shall, within the limits of legislative appropriations, be reimbursed up to fifty percent of the amount expended for space costs in excess of the amount provided by the federal government.

SECTION 5. DIRECTOR OF REGIONAL CENTER - MEDICAL DIRECTOR. Each regional human service center shall be headed by a regional director appointed by and accountable to the executive director of the department of human services. Each regional director shall have the authority to employ the staff necessary to discharge the Center's responsibilities. The regional director shall also have authority, subject to the approval of the executive director of the department and within the limit of legislative appropriations, to make contractual arrangements with public or private agencies or with individuals and organizations to discharge the regional human service center's service delivery responsibilities. The staff of each regional human service center shall include a gualified medical professional who shall be designated as the medical director of the center. The medical director shall be primarily responsible for coordinating mental health and medically related services. The medical director's position may be part time or full time as determined appropriate by the regional director, with the concurrence of the executive director. At the discretion of the executive director, the regional director of a center, if qualified therefor, could also be appointed medical director of that center. As used in this section, "qualified medical professional"

SECTION 6. OFFICE AND OFFICE EQUIPMENT. The department of human services shall be provided with suitable offices in the state capitol. The department may purchase through the department of accounts and purchases, out of the funds appropriated, any furniture, office and filing equipment, office supplies, stationery, and postage necessary for the efficient conduct of department business.

SECTION 7. BIENNIAL REPORT TO GOVERNOR AND DEPARTMENT OF ACCOUNTS AND PURCHASES. The department of human services shall submit to the governor and the department of accounts and purchases a biennial report as prescribed by section 54-06-04.

SECTION 8. AUTHORITY TO ADOPT RULES. The department of human services may adopt rules necessary to carry out its responsibilities under this Act. All rules adopted shall be published in the North Dakota Administrative Code. Rules adopted by agencies prior to the effective date of this Act which relate to functions or agencies covered by this Act shall remain in effect until such time as they are specifically amended or repealed by the department. SECTION 9. AMENDMENT. Section 25-01-01.1 of the 1979 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

25-01-01.1. STATE COUNCIL ON DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES. There is hereby created and shall be maintained in the state department of heatth human <u>services</u> a state council on developmental disabilities consisting of one representative of each of the following departments, divisions, institutions, and organizations designated by the head of such agency or organization:

- 1. Office of superintendent of public instruction.
- Secial-service-beard-of North Dakota department of human services.
- 3. State department of health.
- 4. Grafton state school.
- 5. Job service North Dakota.
- 6. Director of institutions.

#### 7---Gommunity-mental-health-and-retardation-and human-servise-center-

The council shall have consumer representation in conformity with federal regulations regarding developmental disabilities. All members of the council shall be appointed by the governor <u>from the list of</u> <u>designees provided by agency heads</u> <u>pursuant to this</u> <u>section</u>. The council shall select its own officers who shall serve for a term of two years commencing on October first of each year. Meetings shall be held at least twice a year or at the call of the chairman or upon notice in writing signed by not less than three members of the council. A simple majority of the council shall constitute a quorum and shall have authority to act upon any matter coming before the council. Members of the council shall be reimbursed in the same manner and at the same rate provided by law for other state officials.

The council shall assist in the development of the state plan for developmental disabilities, monitor and evaluate the implementation of such state plan, review and comment on all state plans in the state which relate to programs affecting persons with developmental disabilities, provide protection and advocacy to developmentally disabled individuals when requested by a state department, division, institution, or organization, and establish a committee on professional standards and certification that will develop rules and regulations for the certification of developmental disability professionals. The council shall also perform studies and surveys of the needs of the developmentally disabled persons in North Dakota, and shall facilitate coordination of the activities of all state departments, divisions, agencies, and institutions having responsibilities.

SECTION 10. AMENDMENT. Section 25-02-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

25-02-04. SUPERINTENDENT TO POSSESS CERTAIN QUALIFICATIONS - EMPLOYEES. The superintendent of the state hospital shall be a certified psychiatrist, who may also be the director of the mental health and alcoholism and drug abuse division. He The superintendent shall appoint with the approval of the state-mental-health-and retardation-division executive director of the department of human services an assistant superintendent of administration who shall be under his supervision and who shall be a qualified and experienced hospital administrator. The superintendent shall appoint and employ the professional staff and define their qualifications and duties. The assistant superintendent shall employ such other personnel as may be necessary and shall define their qualifications and duties.

SECTION 11. AMENDMENT. Section 25-02-09 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

25-02-09. CARE OF PATIENTS TO BE IMPARTIAL -EXCEPTIONS. All patients at the state hospital shall be provided with equal care and treatment in accordance with the different degrees or conditions of mental and physical health. However, if relatives or friends of any patient shall request it and pay the expenses thereof, such that patient may receive special care and be provided with a special attendant in such a manner as may be agreed upon by the superintendent. In all-suck these cases, the charges for special care and attendants shall be paid quarterly in advance. The relatives or friends of any patient in the hospital shall have the privilege of paying any portion or all of the expenses of such that patient and the superintendent shall cause the account of such that patient to be credited with any sums so paid. The superintendent shall account to the state mental health-and-retardation-division department of human services for all money or property which shall come into his the superintendent's hands for the purpose of furnishing extra care or treatment to any patient at the state hospital.

SECTION 12. AMENDMENT. Section 25-10-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

25-10-01. STATE MENTAL HEALTH AND RETARDATION ALCOHOLISM AND DRUG ABUSE DIVISION. There is hereby established within the state department of health human services a division to be known as the state mental health and retardation alcoholism and drug abuse division, such-division-to-be-under-the-direction-and supervision-of-a-certified-psychiatrist-who-shall-be appeinted-by-the-state-health-officer-with-the-approval of-the-state-health-efficer-with-the-approval of-the-state-health-efficer-with-the-approval superintendent of the state hospital, to perform the following functions in the field of mental health:

- Cooperate in providing services to state and local departments and agencies and other groups for programs of prevention of mental illness, mental retardation, and other psychiatric disabilities.
- 2. Assist in providing informational and educational services regarding mental health to the public and lay and professional groups.
- Assist in providing consultative services to schools, courts, and health and welfare agencies, both public and private.
- Assist in providing outpatient diagnostic and treatment services.
- Assist in providing rehabilitation services for patients suffering from mental or emotional disorders, mental retardation, and other psychiatric conditions, particularly those who have received prior treatment in an inpatient facility.

The above services shall be undertaken by the state department of health <u>human services</u> to the extent funds are available to the department for the performance of these functions.

SECTION 13. AMENDMENT. Section 25-10-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

25-10-04. TRANSFER OF INSTITUTIONS UNDER THE DIRECTOR OF INSTITUTIONS. The administration and control of the state hospital at Jamestown is hereby transferred from the director of institutions to the-mental-health and-retardation-division-of the state department of health human services.

SECTION 14. AMENDMENT. Section 27-21-01 of the 1979 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

27-21-01. CREATION OF STATE YOUTH AUTHORITY -DIRECTOR. A state youth authority is hereby created and established with such the powers and duties as-are prescribed by this chapter. The state youth authority shall be created within the secial-service-beard department of human services, and its chief administrative officer shall be the executive director of the secial-service-beard department of human services, or his designee.

SECTION 15. AMENDMENT. Subsection 5 of section 39-08-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

> 5. The court may, upon a conviction of a person under this section, but prior to sentencing, refer him the person to an addiction facility licensed by the North Dakota state department of health for diagnosis. Upon receipt of the results of this diagnosis, the court may impose a sentence as prescribed in this section or it may sentence the person to treatment in a facility approved by the North Dakota state department of health7-division-of-algebelism and-drug-abuse human services.

SECTION 16. AMENDMENT. Section 50-01.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

50-01.1-01. DEFINITIONS. As used in this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:

- "State board" shall-mean-the-social-service beard-of-North-Dakota means the department of human services.
- "County board" shall-mean means the county welfare social service boards.

SECTION 17. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 50-01.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

> A plan for the creation of a multicounty welfare district prepared by a county board shall provide for the method of operation of the consolidated office, its administration, its location, the disbursements from public funds, and the accountability of funds and manner of reporting receipts and disbursements.

Assume the duties of the former division of alcoholism and drug abuse as set forth in chapter 54-38.

The plan shall provide that all services provided by county officials to county boards under the provisions of this code shall be provided by those county officials residing within the same county wherein the office of the multicounty welfare district is located. The plan shall also provide for the distribution of property owned by each of the county boards affected by the consolidation. Such The plan may also provide that the pregram superviser regional director of a state-board area-seeial regional human service center shall serve as the director of the multicounty welfare district.

SECTION 18. AMENDMENT. Section 50-06-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

50-06-01. DEFINITION. Whenever the word "board" is used in this chapter, it shall mean the **seeial-service** beard-of-North-Dakota <u>department of human services</u>.

SECTION 19. AMENDMENT. Section 50-06-01.1 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

50-06-01.1. SOCIAL-SERVICE-BOARD-OF-NORTH-DAKOTA DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES TO BE SUBSTITUTED FOR PUBLIC WELFARE BOARD OF NORTH DAKOTA AND SOCIAL SERVICE BOARD OF NORTH DAKOTA, MEMBERS OF BOARD, AND EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR. Wherever the terms "public welfare board of North Dakota", "social service board of North Dakota", "executive director of the public welfare board", or "executive director of the social service board", or "executive director of the social service board", or of the public welfare board", or "member of the social service board", or any derivative of those terms which, when used in context indicates an intention to refer to those persons or that board, shall appear in the North Dakota Century Code, the term "social-service-board-of North-Daketa" "department of human services", or the term "executive director of the social-service-board department of human services", as the case may be, shall be substituted therefor. It is the intent of the legislative assembly that the social-service-board-of North-Daketa department of human services shall be substituted for, shall take any action previously to be taken by, and shall perform any duties previously to be taken by, and shall perform any duties previously to be taken by, the public welfare board of North Dakota or by the social service board of North Dakota.

SECTION 20. AMENDMENT. Section 50-06-05.1 of the 1979 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

50-06-05.1. POWERS AND DUTIES OF THE BOARD <u>DEPARTMENT</u>. The secial-service-beard-of North Dakota <u>department of human services</u> shall have the following powers and duties to be administered by such-beard the <u>department</u> through its state office or through regional <u>effices</u> <u>human service centers</u> or otherwise as directed by it:

- To act as the official agency of the state in any social welfare or human service activity initiated by the federal government not otherwise by law made the responsibility of another state agency.
- To administer, allocate, and distribute any state and federal funds that may be made available for the purpose of providing financial assistance, care, and services to eligible persons and families who do not have

sufficient income or other resources to provide a reasonable subsistence compatible with decency and health.

- To provide preventive, rehabilitative, and other seeial human services to help families and individuals to retain or attain capability for independence or self-care.
- To do needed research and study in the causes of social problems and to define appropriate and effective techniques in providing preventive and rehabilitative services.
- To provide for the study, and to promote the well-being of deprived, unruly, and delinquent children.
- To provide for the placing and supervision of children in need of substitute parental care, subject to the control of any court having jurisdiction and control of any such child.
- 7. To recommend appropriate social legislation to the legislative assembly.
- To direct and supervise county social service board activities as may be financed in whole or in part by or with funds allocated or distributed by the beard department.
- 9. To inform the public as to social conditions and ways of meeting social needs.
- 10. To secure, hold, and administer for the purpose for which it is established, any property and any funds donated to it either by will or deed, or otherwise, or through court order or otherwise available to the beard department, and to administer said funds or property in accordance with the instructions in the instrument creating them or in accordance with the instructions in the court order or otherwise.
- 11. To formulate standards and make appropriate inspections and investigations in accordance with such standards in connection with all licensing activities delegated by law to the beard department including child-care facilities, nonmedical adult-care facilities and maternity homes, and persons or organizations receiving and placing children, and to require such facilities, persons, and organizations to submit such reports and information as the board may determine necessary.
- To permit the making of any surveys of seeial welfare human service needs and activities if deemed by the beard department to be necessary and expedient.
- 13. To issue subpoenas, administer oaths, and compel attendance of witnesses and production of documents or papers whenever the beard department deems it necessary in making the investigations provided for herein or in the discharge of its other duties. A subpoena shall not be issued to compel the production of documents or papers relating to any private child-caring or child-placing agency or maternity hospital or to compel the attendance as a witness of any officer or employee of such those facilities except upon the order of a

judge of the district court of the judicial district in which the facilities are located.

- 14. To provide insofar as staff resources permit appropriate seeial human services, including social histories, social or socialpsychological evaluations, individual, group, family, and marital counseling, and related consultation, when referred by self, parent, guardian, county social service board, court, physician, or other individual or agency, and when application is made by self (if an adult or emancipated youth), parent, guardian, or agency having custody; also, on the same basis, to provide seeial human services to children and adults in relation to their placement in or return from the Grafton state school, state hospital, or North Dakota industrial school.
- 15. To provide marital counseling to individuals ordered to participate in such treatment by the family court.
- 16. To provide insofar as staff resources permit social services, including social-psychological evaluations, predisposition reports, treatment, probation, and aftercare services when requested by the judge of a juvenile court, all reports to be kept confidential for the use of the judge except as may be disclosed by the judge.
- 17. To provide insofar as staff resources permit social services, including social-psychological evaluations, predisposition reports, treatment, and probation and parole services, when requested by the judge in a criminal case, all reports to be kept confidential for use by the judge except as may be disclosed by the judge.
- 18. To act as the official agency of the state in the administration of the food stamp program in conformity with the Food Stamp Act of 1964, as amended, and to direct and supervise county administration of sweak that program. Provided, however, that the beard department with the consent of the legislative council committee on budget may terminate the program should the rate of federal financial participation in administrative costs provided under Public Law 93-347 be decreased or limited, or should the state or counties become financially responsible for all or a portion of the coupon bonus payments under the Food Stamp Act.
- 19. To administer, allocate, and distribute any funds made available for the making of direct cash assistance payments, housing assistance payments, and rental subsidies under any rental assistance programs initiated by the federal government not otherwise by law made the responsibility of another state agency possessing statewide jurisdiction.

SECTION 21. AMENDMENT. Section 50-06-06.2 of the 1979 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

50-06-06.2. CLINIC SERVICES - PROVIDER QUALIFICATION - UTILIZATION OF FEDERAL FUNDS. Within the limits of legislative appropriation therefor and in accordance with rules and-regulations established by the social-service-board department of human services, the board department may defray the costs of preventive diagnostic, therapeutic, rehabilitative, or palliative items or services furnished medical assistance eligible individuals by+

Within the limits of legislative appropriations and to the extent permitted by state and federal law and regulations established thereunder, it is the intent of the legislative assembly that federal funds available under title XIX of the Social Security Act [42 U.S.C. 1396 et seq.] be utilized to defray the costs of identifiable mental health clinic services furnished eligible individuals in qualifying regional human service and-mental-health certs and that federal funds available under title XX of the <u>Social Security</u> Act [42 U.S.C. 1397 et seq.] be utilized to defray the costs of identifiable social services furnished eligible individuals by county social service boards<sub>7</sub>-area-secial service-centers, and <u>regional</u> human service centers.

SECTION 22. AMENDMENT. Section 50-06.1-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

50-06.1-01. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter, unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:

- "State board" shall-mean-the-secial-service beard-of means the North Dakota department of human services.
- "Division" shall-mean means the division of vocational rehabilitation.
- "Division executive director" shall-mean means the director of the division of vocational rehabilitation.
- "Regulations"-shall-mean-regulations-made "Rules" means rules adopted by the division executive director with the approval of the state-board executive director of the department of human services.

SECTION 23. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 50-09-01 of the 1979 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

SECTION 25. AMENDMENT. Section 50-24.1-03 of the 1979 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

50-24.1-03. COUNTY SHARE OF MEDICAL ASSISTANCE -REIMBURSEMENT FOR CLINIC SERVICES NOT REQUIRED. Each county in this state shall reimburse the state department for amounts expended for medical assistance in each that county in excess of the amount provided by the federal government, in the amount of fifteen percent. This section shall not be construed to require a county to reimburse the state department for clinic services furnished by mental-health-and-retardation-services-units or regional human service centers-but-it-shall-also-not be-construed-as-preventing-payments-under-chapter-25-12.

SECTION 26. AMENDMENT. Section 50-26-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

50-26-01. ESTABLISHMENT OF GOVERNOR'S COUNCIL ON HUMAN RESOURCES - CERTAIN COMMITTES TO CONSTITUTE -APFOINTMENT. There is hereby established a governor's council on human resources, to be maintained within the department of human services, which shall consist of a committee on aging, a committee on children and youth, a committee on any a committee on children and youth, a committee on any a committee on children and youth, a committee on any be appointed. These Each of these other committees whe-have having a related interest in human resources as may be appointed. These Each of these of no more than nine members, each of whom shall be appointed by the governor for a term of three years, staggered so that the terms of one-third of the members of each committee expire July first of each year, except that initial appointments to the committees shall be made on the basis of a one-year term for one-third of the members of each committee; and a full three-year term for the remaining members of each committee. Each of the executive committees of the governor's council on human resources may appoint to their committee the chairman of the mayor's committee or his designated representative. A vacancy occurring other than by reason of the expiration of a term shall be filled in the same manner as original appointments, except that such appointment shall be made for the remainder of the unexpired term only.

SECTION 27. AMENDMENT. Section 50-26-04 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

50-26-04. EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE - POWERS -EMPLOYMENT OF EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR. The executive committee of the governor's council on human resources shall consist of the respective chairman and vice chairman of the committees which constitute the council. They shall select a chairman from their membership and shall meet at such times and at such places as the chairman may direct. Members of the executive committee shall receive the same mileage and expenses for performance of their official duties as is provided in section 50-26-03. It shall be the duty of the executive committee to determine the number of meetings each committee shall hold, the areas in which they shall devote their time, and generally, to supervise all functions of any committee. The executive committee shall coordinate all functions of the council with other state departments, agencies, and other organizations and shall assure that the council cooperate with such departments, agencies, and other organizations wherever possible. The executive committee of the governor's council shall, with the approval of the geverner appoint a full-time director of the council on human resources whose duty it shall be to assist the committees in any manner authorized by the executive committee of the council. The executive committee of the council may authorize the <u>council</u> director to employ such clerical help as they deem necessary. The compensation of the director and clerical help shall be set by the executive <u>committee-of-the-council director of the department of human services</u> within appropriations by the legislative assembly. A special operating fund for the governor's council on human resources shall be maintained within the state treasury. All expenditures from such fund shall be within the limits of legislative appropriations and shall be made upon vouchers, signed and approved by the <u>chairman-of-the</u> executive committee <u>director of the</u> <u>department of human services</u>. Upon <u>approval of such</u> vouchers by the <u>state-auditing-beard office of the</u> <u>budget</u>, warrant-checks shall be prepared by the <u>department of accounts and purchases</u>. All moneys received as gifts, donations, or bequests and all federal moneys received shall be deposited in <u>such the</u> special operating fund. The state treasurer shall make periodic transfers upon order of the director of the department of accounts and purchases from the governor's council on human resources general fund appropriation to such special operating fund whenever its balance falls so low as to require supplementation. The executive committee is authorized on behalf of the council to accept any federal funds and any other gifts and money from any source that may be offered to them.

SECTION 28. AMENDMENT. Subsection 1 of section 54-07-01.2 of the 1979 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

SECTION 29. AMENDMENT. Section 54-38-01 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

54-38-01. DEFINITIONS. In this chapter unless the context or subject matter otherwise requires:

- "Alcoholic" shall-mean means any person who chronically and habitually uses alcoholic beverages to the extent that he has lost the power of self-control with respect to the use of such beverages, or while chronically or habitually under the influence of alcoholic beverages, endangers public morals, health, safety, or welfaret.
- "Department" shall-mean means the state department of health; human services.
- "Patients" shall-mean means persons who are under the supervision or care of the department<sub>7</sub>.
- "Alcoholism" shall-mean means the pathological condition attendant upon the excessive and habitual use of alcoholic beverages;.
- "Division" shall-mean means the division of mental health and alcoholism and drug abuse within the state department of health; human services.
- "Drug abuse" shell-mean means the use of drugs solely for their stimulant, depressant, or hallucinogenic effect upon the higher functions

of the central nervous system and not as a therapeutic agent prescribed in the course of medical treatment or in a program of research operated under the direction of a physician or pharmacologist7-and\_

 "Drug dependent persons" shall-mean means any person who has developed a state of psychic or physical dependence, or both, upon a drug following administration of that drug upon a repeated periodic or continuous basis.

SECTION 30. AMENDMENT. Section 54-38-05 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

54-38-05. DUTIES OF DEPARTMENT. The department shall:

- Study alcoholism and drug abuse and related problems, including methods and facilities available for the care, custody, detention, treatment, employment, and rehabilitation of resident alcoholics and drug dependent persons;.
- 2. Promote meetings and programs for the discussion of alcoholism and drug abuse or any of their aspects, disseminate information on the subject of alcoholism and drug abuse for the guidance and assistance of individuals, courts, and public or private agencies for the prevention of alcoholism and drug abuse, and inform and educate the general public on problems of alcoholism and drug abuse, their prevention and treatment, to the end that alcoholism and drug abuse may be prevented and that persons suffering from alcoholism or drug dependency may be disposed to seek available treatment<sub>7</sub>.
- Conduct, promote, and finance, in full or in part, studies, investigations, and research, independently or in cooperation with universities, colleges, scientific organizations, and public or private agencies;.
- Accept for examination, diagnosis, guidance, and treatment, insofar as funds permit, any resident of the state coming to the department of his own volition for advice and guidance;
- Establish, from time to time, policies governing the acceptance, care, and treatment of alcoholics and drug dependent persons;-and
- 6---Employ-such-assistants-as-may-be-necessary-The-present-staff-of-chapter-54-38-may-be transferred-to-the-newly-created-division-of alcoholism-and-drug-abuse-within-the-state department-of-health.

SECTION 31. AMENDMENT. Section 54-40-09 of the 1979 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

54-40-09. <u>REGIONAL</u> HUMAN SERVICE CENTERS - POWERS - DUTIES. Human <u>Regional human</u> service centers organized under this chapter are those centers established to provide human services **otherwise** as authorized by law by the-state-or-any-of-its-political-subdivisions. The term "human service" means service provided to individuals or their families in need thereof to help them achieve, maintain, or support the highest level of personal

independence and economic self-sufficiency, including independence and economic self-sufficiency, including health, mental health, education, manpower, social, vocational rehabilitation, aging, food and nutrition, and housing service. Human <u>Regional human</u> service centers shall function as <u>single-cellecated</u> regional administrative units established, within the multicounty areas designated by the governor's executive order 49 dated September 18, 1969, to provide for the planning and delivery of human services. Human Regional human service centers shall provide human services to all eligible individuals and families to help them achieve or maintain social, emotional and economic self-sufficiency; prevent, reduce, or eliminate dependency; prevent or remedy the neglect, abuse, or exploitation of children and of adults unable to protect their own interests; aid in the preservation, rehabilitation, and reuniting of families; prevent or reduce inappropriate institutional care by providing for care while institutionalized or providing for community-based or other forms of less restrictive care; and secure referral or admission for institutional care--Human-servise-center-beards-shall-plan-and-develop health-and-social-resources-to-assure-the-effective-and efficient-delivery-of-high-quality-human-services-fully accessible-to-all-citizens---Human-service-center-boards shall-maximize-the-coordination-and-integration-of services-and-functions-to-the-fullest-extent-practicable to-avoid-unnecessary-duplication-and-overlapping-of functions-and-services---A-human-service-center-shall-be established-upon-a-majority-vote-of-those-commissioners within-a-multicounty-area-present-at-a-joint-meeting-of the-boards-of-county-commissioners-called-by-the-chairman of-the-board-of-county-commissioners-of-the-county-with the-largest-population---Following-that-majority-vote; the-state-department-of-health--the-state-social-service board,-the-mental-health-and-retardation-service-units shally-and-other-state-departments-and-governmental-units performing-human-service-functions-within-the-multicounty area-may,-pursuant-to-written-agreement-entered-into-by their-respective-boards-or-agencies-with-the-center board--identify-and-delegate-the-planning-and-delivery-of specified-human-services-within-their-jurisdiction-to-the human-service-center---Human; provide outpatient diagnostic and treatment services; and provide rehabilitation services for patients suffering from mental or emotional disorders, mental retardation, and other psychiatric conditions, particularly for those patients who have received prior treatment in an inpatient facility. Regional human service centers shall deliver such-human services in the manner prescribed by the state departments-and-governmental-units-accountable for-such-services department of health and human services. The governing-body human service council of a human service center shall be a beard-of-directors council of not more than thirteen members appointed by the boards of county commissioners of the respective counties within the multiceunty-area region meeting jointly with the director of the regional human service center. The terms of office shall be three two years or less and arranged so that the term of one-third, calculated-as-hearly-as-practicable; six members shall expire in-one-year; the term-of-one-half; calculated-as nearly-as-practicable7-of-the-remaining-members-in-the next-year, at the end of the first year and the term of the remaining seven members shall expire at the end of New-appointments-to-the-board the third second year. shall-be-made-in-accordance-with-the-procedure-adopted-by a-majority-of-the-commissioners-attending-a-joint-meeting ef-the-beards-of-county-commissioners-of-the-multicounty area. Members of each human service council are to be selected on the basis of population from residents of the

area. Members of each human service council are to be selected on the basis of population from residents of the counties in the region served by the human service center. Each county in the region must have at least one member on the human service council. Members shall elect trom the council membership a chairman and other officers as the council deems necessary. All members of each council shall be residents of the area served by the council shall be residents of the area served by the regional human service center. Vacancies occuring on the board for other than the expiration of a term shall be filled in the same manner as original appointments, except that appointments shall be made only for the unexpired term. Members of the beard human service council shall be compensated at the rate of forty-five dollars per day, not to exceed twenty-five days in any one year. The members shall also be paid for <u>mileage and</u> <u>actual</u> expenses incurred in attending meetings and in the performance of their official duties in the amounts provided by law for other state officers. SECTION 32. <u>DUTIES OF HUMAN SERVICE COUNCIL. The</u> <u>human service councils of the regional human service</u> <u>centers shall perform the following duties:</u>

- Assist in needs assessment and the planning and development of health and social resources to assure the effective and efficient delivery of high quality human services fully accessible to all citizens.
- 2. Review and evaluate services and programs provided by the centers and make periodic reports to the state department of human services together with any recommendations the councils may have for improvement in services, programs, or facilities.
- Promote cooperation and working agreements with private human service agencies.
- Review the budgets for submission to the executive director for consideration and submission within the budget request for the state department of human services.
- 5. Promote local and regional financing from public and private sources.

SECTION 33. AMENDMENT. Section 54-42-06 of the 1979 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

54-42-06. AGENCIES SUBJECT TO MERIT SYSTEM. All personnel employed by the seetal-service-beard-of-North Baketa department of human services, the area-and-county regional offices of such-beard that department, the job service North Dakota, the North Dakota merit system council, the North Dakota state department of health, and other agencies or political subdivisions as may by federal laws or regulations be required to be subject to the merit system in order to obtain federal grants-inaid, shall be covered by the complete merit system provided in this chapter. The-merit-system-council -ahall provide-merit-system-coverage-to-mental-health-and retardation-service-units,-human-service-centers,-and other-units-resulting-from-combinations-of-mental-health and-retardation-service-units7-area-secial-service centers,-and-other-functions-or-services-of-state agencies-or-political-subdivisions-upon-the-request-of such-centers-or-units- Merit system coverage shall also be provided to personnel employed as purchasing agents or buyers in the purchasing division of the department of accounts and purchases. Such other agencies, departments or divisions, or positions, shall be placed under the complete or limited merit system in the manner and to the extent the legislative assembly shall by law direct.

SECTION 34. AMENDMENT. Section 54-44.3-19 of the 1979 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

54-44.3-19. BOARD AUTHORITY TO PROVIDE SERVICE TO CITIES AND POLITICAL SUBDIVISIONS. The board may enter into agreement with any city or political subdivision of this state to furnish any of its services and facilities, other than factfinding or conciliation services, and such agreement shall provide for reimbursement to the state of the cost of the services and facilities furnished. All cities and political subdivisions of this state may enter into such agreements. The board and division shall provide coverage to other agencies or political subdivisions as may by federal laws or regulations be required to be subject to a personnel system in order to obtain federal grants-in-aid. The board and division shall provide coverage to mental-health-and-retardation service-units,-human-service-centers,-and-other-units resulting-from-combinations-of-mental-health-and retardation-service-units7-area-seeial-service-centers7 and other functions or services of state agencies or political subdivisions upon the request of such centers or units. Such other agencies, departments, or divisions, or positions, shall be placed under the complete or limited board and division personnel plan in the manner and to the extent the legislative assembly shall by law direct.

SECTION 35. LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL - AUTHORITY TO CHANGE REFERENCES TO NEW DEPARTMENT AND TO REDESIGNATE SECTION 54-40-09. The North Dakota legislative council is hereby authorized to delete, where appropriate, references to the social service board of North Dakota or to the executive director of the social service board wherever they appear in the North Dakota Century Code or in the supplements thereto and to replace each deleted reference with a reference to the North Dakota department of human services or to the executive director of the department of human services, as appropriate. The legislative council is also authorized to redesignate and renumber section 54-40-09 of the 1979 Supplement to the Morth Dakota Century Code to a place in the North Dakota Century Code consistent with the placement of the department of human services. These changes are to be made when any volume or supplement of the North Dakota Century Code is being reprinted.

SECTION 36. REPEAL. As used in this Act, "agricultural operation" means the science and art of production of plants and animals useful to man, by a corporation as provided in chapter 10-06, a partnership, or a proprietorship, and including, to a variable extent, the preparation of these products for man's use and their disposal by marketing or otherwise, and shall include horticulture, floriculture, viticulture, forestry, dairy, livestock, poultry, bee, and any and all forms of farm products, and farm production.
- 3. The provisions on subsection 1 of this section shall not affect or defeat the right of any person to recover damages for any injury or damage sustained by him on account of any pollution of or change in the condition of the waters of any stream or on account of any overflow of lands of any such person.
- 4. Any ordinance or resolution of any unit of local government that makes the operation of any agricultural operation a nuisance or provides for the abatement thereof as a nuisance under the circumstances set forth in this section is void; except that the provisions of this subsection shall not apply when a nuisance results from the negligent or improper operation of any such agricultural operation or from an agricultural operation located within the corporate limits of any city as of the effective date of this Act.

After the declaration by one or both of the parties that an impasse does exist, the parties shall meet and, within five days, select a mediator or mediators, who shall meet with the parties or their representatives, or both, either jointly or separately, and shall take such other steps as may be appropriate in order to persuade the parties to resolve their differences and effect a mutually acceptable agreement. By agreement between the parties, the mediator selected as provided herein may be supplied by the federal mediation and conciliation association, with expenses to be shared by the parties.
- b. If five days have elapsed from the time an impasse is declared and no mediator or mediators are selected, either party may request that the commission appoint a mediator. Upon receiving the request, the commission shall within five days appoint a mediator, who shall meet with the parties or their representatives, or both, either jointly or separately, and shall take such other steps as may be appropriate in order to persuade the parties to resolve their differences and effect a mutually acceptable agreement.
- c. If mediation is unable to effect settlement of the controversy within twenty days after appointment of the mediator or mediators, either party may, by written notification to the other, demand that their differences be submitted to the commission. Notwithstanding the right of either party to demand that the issues be submitted to the commission, submission of the issues to the commission must be by mutual consent and if either party makes objection thereto, the resolution of the unresolved issues between the parties shall thereafter be submitted to arbitration as set out in this Act. In the event that the services of the commission are used, the costs shall be borne equally between the parties.
- d. Upon receiving the demand, the commission, or a factfinder appointed by the commission from a list of gualified persons maintained by the commission, shall investigate the facts and the commission shall make its findings and recommendation to the parties,

either upon its own investigation or upon consideration of the investigation and recommendation of a factfinder appointed by the commission, together with such other investigation as the commission shall choose to make. The findings and recommendation of the commission shall be transmitted to the contending parties within twenty days after the receipt by the commission of the demand for factfinding. The recommendation of the commission as thus determined and transmitted to the parties shall be advisory only, unless the parties have agreed in writing, prior thereto, to make the recommendation binding.

- e. In the event that the recommendation has not been made binding, and if no agreement has been reached within ten days after receipt by the parties of the recommendation of the commission, the parties shall, within five days after the conclusion of the ten-day period, each submit to an arbitration panel, as selected according to this subdivision, their agreed upon. They shall also stipulate those items which have been agreed upon and which are to be excluded from arbitration. To create a panel, the representative organization shall select one person, the board shall select one person, and those board shall select one person, and those two persons shall within five days select a third person, who shall serve as the panel's chairperson. If the representative organization's panelist and the board's panelist are unable to agree on a third person within five days, the commission chall provide the two parties with a lifet person within five days, the commission shall provide the two parties with a list of five names, and after determining by lot which party strikes the first name, the representative organization's panelist and the board's panelist shall, in turn, each strike a name from the list until only one strike a name from the list until only one name remains, and that person shall be the third member of the panel and the chairperson. After a thorough review of the unresolved issues, the panel shall then resolve all such issues by selecting one or the other of the final offers in its partirety. In making its docision the entirety. In making its decision, the panel shall be bound to give consideration to all of the following factors:
  - (1) Prior negotiations.
  - (2) Interests and welfare of the employee group.
  - (3) Cost of living.
  - (4) Comparison of existing conditions of employment of employee groups and similar groups.
  - (5) Salaries, fringe benefits, and other conditions of employment in the state labor market.
  - (6) The total financial resources available to the district. Provided, the panel shall not commit the board to expenditures beyond the total

<u>financial resources available to the</u> <u>district.</u>

All costs of the arbitration shall be shared equally by the parties.

- f. The board shall accept or reject the decision of the arbitration panel issued pursuant to subdivision e of this subsection within five days of receipt of the panel's written decision.
  - (1) If the board accepts the panel's decision, the decision shall be final and binding on both parties. A contract shall be issued which incorporates the terms and conditions of the panel's decision on disputed items and the parties' stipulation on undisputed items.
  - (2) If the board rejects the panel's decision, the board shall submit the question "Shall the decision of the arbitration panel be upheld?" to the electorate of the school district. The board shall cause a legal notice to appear which shall solely contain the last best offers and rationale which both parties submitted to the panel and the decision and rationale of the panel. The election shall be held no sconer than ten days and no later than twenty days after the board's official rejection of the panel's decision.

  - b. "Beginning farmer" means any person who:
    - (1) Is a resident of this state.
    - (2) Receives more than half his annual income from farming, unless the person initially commences farming during the tax year for which a deduction will be claimed under this section.
    - (3) Intends to use any farmland that he wishes to purchase or rent for agricultural purposes.
    - (4) Has had adequate training, by experience or education, in the type of farming operation which he wishes to begin on the purchased or rented land.
    - (5) Has, including his dependents and spouse, if any, a net worth of less than fifty thousand dollars, not including the value of their equity in their principal residence, the value of one personal or family motor vehicle, and the value of their household goods, including furniture, appliances, musical instruments, clothing, and other personal belongings.
  - c. "Landowner" means any person owning land in North Dakota, except that any person who acquires such land for the purpose of obtaining the income tax deduction provided for in this section shall not be deemed to be a landowner.
- 5. In order for an individual, estate or trust to qualify for the above stated exclusions, the taxpayer must obtain a notarized statement from the beginning farmer who purchased or rented the land, containing a list of the assets, debts, and net worth of the beginning farmer, together with such other information as the tax commissioner may require. The value placed on any real property located in North Dakota and owned by the buyer shall be the amount listed as the current market value on the most recent real estate tax statement for that particular plece of property. In determining the net worth of any person, including dependents and spouse, if any, for purposes of this section, the value of their equity in their principal residence, the value of their household goods, including furniture, appliances, musical instruments, clothing, and other personal belongings shall not be included. This statement shall be filed with the taxpayer's income tax return. The taxpayer must also certify that any rental arrangements with any other person 3 of this section."
