REPORT OF STANDING COMMITTEE

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. DECLARATION AND FINDING OF PUBLIC PURPOSE. The legislative assembly of the state of North Cakota hereby declares and finds that it is and has been its purpose in preparing and adopting the provisions of this Act to sanction, authorize, and encourage new persons beginning a career in agriculture. The legislative body recognizes that startup costs in agriculture are extremely high due to inflated land, machinery and other agricultural input costs, and that these costs may make it prohibitive for young persons to begin farming. Because the legislative assembly recognizes the importance of enabling new persons to begin a career in farming, and the benefits derived by the community and the state from having new persons engaged in farming, it is the intent of this legislative assembly that the various boards of county commissioners give special consideration in the collection of ad valorem taxes on farmland owned or purchased by beginning farmers. It is further the intent of the legislative assembly that the various boards of county commissioners grant exemptions to new farmers from the ad valorem tax in cases where such exemptions may make a significant difference in the ability of a new farmer to make his farming operation a viable one which will continue to exist in the community, thus adding to the population and economic base of the rural community.

SECTION 2. DEFINITIONS. In this Act, unless the text or context or subject matter otherwise requires, "beginning farmer " means any person who meets the requirements of section 57-38-67.

SECTION 3. REAL ESTATE TAX EXEMPTIONS FOR BEGINNING FARMERS. The board of county commissioners of any county is hereby authorized and empowered, in their discretion, to grant, after negotiation with a beginning farmer, a partial or complete exemption from ad valorem taxation on farmland for a period not to exceed five years from the date of purchase of the farmland. The board of county commissioners shall notify the tax commissioner of such actions within ninety days of the granting of an exemption."

The salaries and wages line item of the State Penitentiary is increased \$229,159 which will provide funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. The salaries and wages line item amount of \$5,781,136 includes \$173,281 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees. The operating expense line item is reduced \$13,459 by subtracting \$51,955 in accordance with legislative guidelines for nine percent annual inflationary increases; and by adding \$38,500 for vocational training laboratories. The operating expense line item includes \$309,581 for natural gas, \$122,429 for electricity, \$63,890 for heating fuel oil, and \$672,340 for food. The estimated income line item is increased \$21,723 for additional amounts of federal reimbursement for federal prisoners and for sale of meals to employees.

Roughrider Industries

The salaries and wages line item for the Roughrider Industries is increased by \$27,135 which will allow funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. The salaries and wages line item amount of \$725,699 includes \$23,623 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees. The operating expense line item is reduced \$50,825 in accordance with legislative guidelines for nine percent annual inflation increases

Rep. Backes: "I rise to a point of personal privilege. It didn't make any difference if we voted it today or tomorrow. I realize the numbers game as well as anyone. But it does sadden me to see our rules stretched to such imagination. It says no question shall be reconsidered more than once in any legislative day. I think we all know that and I could have risen and challenged the Speaker, and lost a vote and went through the whole works. But the question is, the final passage of a bill, not how the motion is put. That was the intent of the rules; that's the way it has always been interpreted; and we stretched it. It doesn't bother me that we did, the bill would have passed anyway, but I think we set a precedent that is bad. It is not good, because we are going to be using this in the future. Watch it. Be sure. Because now if the bill loses, you can reconsider it, and if it wins, it is a different question, and you can reconsider it again and if it is tied, you can reconsider it again. One of the best things that has come out of the rules committee over the last several years is the rule on the constant reconsideration of measures in a day. It has speeded up our legislative process immensely. I hope we don't use this gimmick to try and go around the rule again."

Senate Bill No. 2202. — A Bill for an Act providing for a reallocation of the appropriation to the junior colleges of the state of North Dakota for the biennium ending June 30, 1981; and declaring an emergency.

relating to the amount of supplementary workmen's compensation benefits and payment from the supplementary benefit fund; and providing that the premium rate may not be increased during the 1981-1983 biennium.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Industry, Business and Labor.

Senate Bill No. 2233. — A Bill for an Act to create and enact sections 10-06-01.1, 10-06-07, 10-06-08, 10-06-09, 10-06-10, 10-06-11, 10-06-12, 10-06-13, and 10-06-14 of the North Dakota Century Code, defining farming or ranching, authorizing certain family-type corporations to engage in farming and ranching, and providing for reports and enforcement; to amend and reenact sections 10-06-01 and 10-06-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, prohibiting farming by corporations with an exception for certain cooperatives; to repeal sections 10-06-02, 10-06-03, 10-06-05, and 10-06-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to disposal of lands acquired by corporations in violation of the law; and to provide a penalty; and declaring an emergency.

Senate Bill No. 2407. — A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 2 of section 57-60-15, section 57-62-01, subsections 1 and 2 of section 57-62-02, and section 57-62-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the allocation of revenues from the coal conversion facilities tax and coal severance tax to certain organized townships.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance and Taxation.

Senate Bill No. 2409. — A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact section 48-09-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to permitting the North Dakota fair associations to grant concessions without letting bids; and to declare an emergency.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

Senate Bill No. 2417. — A Bill for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 11-10.1-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the powers and duties of the county director of tax equalization.

Senate Bill No. 2424. — A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact sections 16-09-01 and 16-21-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the use of voting machines in all election precincts.

FIRST READING OF SENATE CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4031. — A concurrent resolution to request appropriate action by the Congress, either acting by consent of two-thirds of both houses or, upon the application of the legislatures of two-thirds of the several states, calling a constitutional convention for the purpose of considering, drafting, and proposing an amendment to the Constitution of the United States to provide protection of the right to life of all human beings.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Social Services and Veterans Affairs.

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4033. — A concurrent resolution establishing the procedures for the Legislative Assembly to call itself into a reconvened session, relating to the call of the special session by the governor, speaking to the role of legislative standing committees, and relating to other matters of legislative procedure.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4035. — A concurrent resolution urging the United States Congress to pass the resolution which has been introduced by Senator Jesse Helms and Representative Robert K. Dornan calling for a right to life amendment to the United States Constitution.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Social Services and Veterans Affairs.

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4037. - A concurrent resolution

urging the Congress of the United States to exercise its power, granted under section 2 of article III of the United States Constitution, to limit the jurisdiction of the United States Supreme Court to prevent deprivation of the right to life from the moment of conception.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Social Services and Veterans Affairs.

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4038. — A concurrent resolution urging the United States Secretary of the Interior to proceed with phased construction of, and to seek consultations on, the authorized Garrison Diversion Unit.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources.

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4048. — A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to conduct a study of state laws governing beekeeping.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4054. — A concurrent resolution to appoint an official photographer for the Forty-seventh Legislative Assembly, to set forth the photography order, and to authorize payment.

Which was read the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Federal Government.
