STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

Board of Higher Education

The \$220,814 appropriation for heating costs at the institutions of higher education is deleted because of revised estimates due to the mild weather this winter.

Business and Industrial Development Department

The amount of \$20,554 is added for salaries for the new director of BIDD for the last six months of the 1979-81 biennium.

School for the Deaf

Estimated income is increased by \$45,000 from interest and income on school lands and the general fund appropriation is reduced by this same amount.

School for the Blind

Estimated income is increased by \$10,619 from interest and income on school lands, and the general fund appropriation is reduced by this same amount.

Grafton State School

The operating expense line item is reduced \$61,824\$ due to revised estimates of heating costs.

The capital improvements line item is increased by \$6,250 from funds from the Soldiers' Home improvement fund for muscellaneous improvements. The estimated income line item is increased \$27,109 by adding \$20,859 from interest and income on school lands and by adding \$6,250 from the Soldiers' Home improvement fund.

Governor's Office

The fees and services line item is increased \$10,300 for Governor Olson transition costs. Also, \$5,000 is added for former Governor Link transition costs.

on behalf of the district by its president or chairman and also by its auditor or secretary, and shall be payable out of funds derived from uncollected taxes levied for the current tax year and four previous years which have not been set aside for the payment of other certificates of indebtedness pursuant to sections 21-02-07, 21-02-08, and 21-02-09 and from funds received under bureau of Indian affairs contracts currently existing. However, a certificate of indebtedness shall be the general obligation of the issuing taxing district.

2. Notwithstanding the borrowing limitations in subsection 1 of this section, a school district may issue certificates of indebtedness for the purpose of repaying a loan to the lands and minerals trust fund which has been made for converting the heating plant to coal. The maximum term for these certificates shall be seven years. If a school district no longer exists, the county auditor shall levy a direct tax against the taxable property in the original borrowing district that will be sufficient to provide for the redemption of the certificates as specified on the certificates."
