REMARKS IN THE JOURNAL

Rep. O. Hanson: "Mr. Speaker and Members of the North Dakota House of Representatives:

"As most of you know, I was born and raised just a stone's throw away from the Canadian border. Having spent all of my life comingling with my Canadian friends to the north, I have some strong feelings in their regard. As growing up in the 1930's, it was more convenient to just go across the border and visit our friends to the north than to go south. I knew more about Dominion Day, July 1, which is their Independence Day than I did about our 4th of July.

"In Sherwood, when we have any event or celebration, it is not unusual to see the Canadian flag standing alongside the American flag. We have an International Memorial Day Service that is one of the oldest in the nation. It goes back to 1937. Over half the trade in Sherwood is Canadian and this is not an isolated incident. Minot, with their International softball, golf, curling, and snowmobile events is a great vacation area for thousands of Canadians, and I am sure other cities in North Dakota do likewise.

"My feelings for my friends run deep, and I am sure yours do too. Still, at times anti-Canadian sentiment crops up from among us and this makes me sad.

"In this day and age of crucial energy needs, our friends to the north have a tremendous supply of natural resources that are readily available to us if we treat them as equals and human beings. Some day down the road we might be standing alone against the world, and if that day ever comes, there is one ally I know we can trust. They have stood by us shoulder to shoulder in World War I, World War II, the Korean War, and the Viet Nam conflict. My dad would have called them 'men to ride the river with'. Today we have with us four members of the Legislative Assembly from Regina, Sask., Canada.
"If I may, I would like to present to you Mr. Eric Berntson,

member of the Legislative Assembly from the Souris-Carrington Riding, Cariville, Sask.; Mr. Allen Engel, member of the Legislative Assembly from the Assiniboia Riding, Assiniboia, Sask.; Mr. John "Jack" Chapman, member of the Legislative Assembly from the Estevan Riding, Estevan, Sask.; and Mr. Randy Nelson, member of the Legislative Assembly from the Yorkton Riding, Yorkton, Sask., I would ask you to accord them the privilege of the North Dakota House of Representatives.'

REMARKS IN THE JOURNAL

The Honorable Randy Nelson: "Mr. Speaker and Members of the House of Representatives: It is indeed a great honor for me to be here to represent our Province, and to speak on behalf of my three other colleagues who are here today.

"I think it is really indicative of the more than 100 years of friendship that Orlin Hanson has just spoken of that has existed between our two countries: friendship that we in our land have greatly valued, and I know that we shall continue to value over the years. It was very interesting for us to tour several of your committees to watch them at work and watch your House at work today. It is always a good thing to see how the other fellow does things. It is mighty different from our own system, but very interesting. I certainly think that each of us could certainly take some pointers, I suppose. I know that we have from you. I am sure.

"We are very pleased to accept the gracious hospitality that has been afforded us this year by Rep. Hanson, House leader of the Minority Group, and all the rest of you. It really makes us feel at home. I know we have often come back and forth across the border to visit friends and relatives, and I am sure that many of you have done the same. You always make us feel at home.

"When we were flying down. John Chapman mentioned that being a Nelson should make me feel very much at home. Governor Olson met us and was so gracious. He talked about being a border rat, and I think most of us are that. We very much appreciate being here, and it is my

pleasure to speak to you.

"I have relatives here, and last night when I was taken to a hotel, one of the first people I was introduced to was Senator Bill Parker. He is my wife's second cousin. Neither one of us knew the other was here. Another indication of our close relationship of our two lands is that my own father comes from the United States. My father used to have a rhyme. I don't remember how it started out, but he always ended it with 'the greatest state in the 48'. Of course, that was back a few years ago. Mind you, he wasn't talking about North Dakota, he was talking about Minnesota.

"We are very pleased that you would accept us and this Canadian invasion. We have four of us that are here; one progressive conservative by the name of Eric Berntson — wonder how he can be progressive and conservative at the same time!

"We have Jack Chapman, whom we call Jack the Giant Killer. He

took Eric's leader there.

"Then we have our eminent pilot for our group, Mr. Engel. He is that daring ace, we call him Ace Engel up there.

"Then there is myself. I am a school teacher; I am of Norwegian ancestry teaching French to Germans, Ukranians and Englishmen. That, too, I think is a thing that our countries have in common — this business of multiculturalism, that so many people from so many lands that are here to make a country, and to make each of our countries stronger and greater because of that multicultural need.

"We have been here today because of the work of Rep. Hanson to start a dialogue on a Souris River project. I think that it is most important that we keep between our two countries that dialogue open so that we better understand each other and keep that understanding strong between us. I am very, very pleased to be a part of that today, but on behalf of our Province and the people of our Province and our three other members of the Legislative Assembly, I would like to make a brief presentation. The first is a sample of what you may have heard of from our Province is potash. This is mined from 3,600 feet beneath the surface of our land and it is 70% of what is sent to your land to be used as fertilizer. I would like to make two other presentations: one is a Saskatchewan pin in the form of the Province itself with the Saskatchewan lily; last but not least, our Saskatchewan flag, that you may remember us as good friends of the North. Thank you very, very much for having us here today."

SENATE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 1184

- on page 5 of the engrossed bill, line 1, after the period delete the word "In" and insert in lieu thereof the following:
 "Reimbursement for private airplane travel shall be calculated as follows:
 - a. If reimbursement is for one properly authorized and reimbursable passenger, reimbursement shall be paid on a per-mile basis as provided in this subsection.
 - b. If reimbursement is claimed for a chartered private aircraft, reimbursement may not exceed the cost of regular coach fare on a commercial flight, if one is scheduled between the point of departure, point of destination, and return, for each properly authorized and reimbursable passenger on the charter flight; or, where there is no such regularly scheduled commercial flight, the actual cost of the charter.

No reimbursement shall be paid for leased private aircraft. In order to be reimbursed for the chartering of a private aircraft pursuant to subdivision b of this subsection, the charter agreement must receive prior approval from the director of the department of accounts and purchases who shall take comparable travel costs and the savings of time into account in making his decision."
