HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTION NO. 3081

Introduced by

Senator Nething

A concurrent resolution providing for the completion of the legislative journals of the House and the Senate.

WHEREAS, after termination of the Forty-seventh Legislative Assembly a complete record with index of the House and Senate journals must be prepared;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE SENATE CONCURRING THEREIN:

That Roy Gilbreath, Chief Clerk of the House, and Leo Leidholm, Secretary of the Senate, are hereby authorized and employed to prepare an index of journals of the Forty-seventh Legislative Assembly, and are also directed to arrange for and procure sufficient assistance to ensure that the foregoing work shall be completed within 30 days after the close of the session; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that for the expenses of the said Roy Gilbreath and Leo Leidholm, in completing the work required above, there shall be allowed the sum of \$3,300 each, which shall include compensation for any assistance which they deem necessary, all to be paid as other legislative expense is paid, and when the respective claims are verified by the affidavits of the said Roy Gilbreath and Leo Leidholm, showing completion of such work.

MOTION

Rep. Strinden moved that the rules be suspended and that Senate Bill No. 2338 be moved to the top of the fourteenth order for second reading and final passage, which motion prevailed.

REQUESTS

Rep. Backes requested that his remarks be printed in the Journal, which request was granted.

Rep. Backes:

"Mr. Speaker, members of the Assembly:

"I've been in this House 20 years. And never in the 20 years have I seen the Mickey Mouse, the shell game, whatever you want to call it, played with the budget as I have this time. And it isn't because we're the smallest minority we've ever been. I've been in this House when there were 15 Democrats. And the games that are played today have never been played in this House. We're trying to fool the people back home by raiding trust funds, by raiding special funds...into believing we're spending less money. That's like a man I knew back home that had two checkbooks. And he was known to go on some parties. And so he used the one checkbook so his wife wouldn't know how much he was spending. And that's exactly what we're doing here. We're trying to cover up spending beyond the Governor's budget. After all the hue and

cry, and the wailing and gnashing of teeth about how wild the Governor's budget was, this one here, when you add the special funds in it, (which probably won't be done by the press and that's maybe why you're doing it this way) is going to be a lot bigger than the Governor's budget. That really bothers me. But the worst part of it all is you're playing Russian Roulette with a program that is desperately needed. And that's the water project of Southwest North Dakota. And I say you're playing roulette because we can fund it without putting it into the jeopardy that I feel it could be in. And I'm referring to either an initiated measure to lock up a trust fund that could take the fund monies away from this appropriation or a referred measure to kill the appropriation. One of the two. That's very possible. And if the voters would agree with the people that referred or initiated the measure, the western water projects would be stalled for another two or four years.

But we can guarantee it by being honest with the people, saying that we gotta spend this \$20 million, or whatever it is. Let's let the people know what we spend here. These shell games just aren't right. And then for Representative Strinden to talk about the coalition having secret meetings; no press! And no hearings! My goodness! What do you think that bill was that came out of the tax committee this morning that changed the whole darn bill, the whole initiated measure? It didn't have a hearing. The Republicans didn't even know about it. You talk about secret meetings?

Now let's get to the real heart of it. The real heart of it is the trust fund, and it really bothers me. I know everyone of you as honorable people. You're good businessmen. And not a one of you do this in your own business. Not a one. And that includes the Republicans. It is expected of the Democrats to do this kind of thing. You know, spend all the money, raid the trust funds. But it isn't expected of the Republicans. And that's what you're doing. And it is expected of the Republicans to have sound fiscal management, and sound fiscal management is to put away some of this money. I think of the farmer who was getting 40 bushels an acre for five years in a row at \$6 a bushel and he spent like a drunken sailor. That's what we're doing. And then when the 40 bushels an acre is not there, and the price goes down to two bucks and he keeps on spending the same way, it isn't possible. And that's what we're leading ourselves into right in this Assembly. It's impossible to have \$500 million from all our money alone in the next biennium budget and not have one penny of trust fund in it. Not one penny. Do you realize that if we never got any more oil money than the \$500 million per biennium for the next several years, it would take a \$2.5 billion trust fund at 10% interest just to replace that? Just to replace that. Now not a one of us sitting and standing believes that we're going to go down tomorrow in our revenues. That \$500 million will probably go to a billion or 2 billion before it starts to decline. Then we're going to be talking about a trust fund to replace those monies of several billions of dollars. And they can't even start with 20-some million? I just can't believe it.

They talk about laying claim to the water. There isn't a word in this amendment or bill about laying claim to the water. You know, that's just a bugaboo that's thrown in here. We can get claim to the water without having the Pipeline Bill. All you have to do is apply for the permit and get the claim. You go and build a project. But two-thirds of you can have a trust fund, as Rep. Strinden argues, that is open-ended, that the Legislative Assembly appropriates out of, and how you can call that a trust fund is sheer folly. There isn't a body of politicians

anywhere, whether it's here or in Washington or in another state, that, when monies are available, they don't find a place to spend it. I say to you we can have both: We can have the trust fund and we can use the monies from the trust fund for the benefit of North Dakota, whether it's water projects or other industrial projects. We can loan out of the trust fund, loan through an authority like the Bank of North Dakota where they look at the repayability of the loan. This Legislative Assembly is not going to look at the repayability of loans. Politics plays too big a factor in this Assembly to do that. This fund will never have anything in it. You can remember what happened to the last trust fund we had that wasn't closed. We spent \$2 million out of it so fast, it wasn't funny. Did we pay it back? No. But that was going to happen. Remember? It didn't work. And that's what I say will happen if we have an open-ended trust fund.

"Let's be responsible citizens. Those people 25 or 50 years from now are really going to condemn us if we haven't got the wisdom to have a trust fund to take care of the monies when this onetime harvest of our natural resources is gone."

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE

STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. DEFINITIONS. As used in this Act, unless the context otherwise plainly requires:

1. "Association" means any club, association, union, brotherhood, fraternity, organization, or group of any kind of two or more persons, including, but not limited to, labor unions, trade associations, professional associations, or governmental associations, which is united for any purpose, business, or object and which assesses any dues, membership fees, or license fees in any amount, or which maintains a treasury fund in any amount. Association shall not include corporations, cooperative corporations, political committees, or political parties.
2. "Candidate" means a person whose name is presented for nomination to public office at any primary election or convention, whether the person is actually nominated or not; a person whose name is printed as a candidate on an official ballot used at any election; or a person who seeks election through write-in votes.
3. "Contribution" means a gift of money or property, subscription, loan, advance, or deposit of money, except a loan of money from a bank or other lending institution made in the regular course of business, made for the purpose of influencing the nomination for election, or election, of any person to office. Contribution also means a contract, promise, or agreement, express or implied, whether or not legally enforceable, to make a contribution for any of the above purposes, and includes funds received by a political committee which are transferred to that committee from another political committee or other source.
4. "Cooperative corporations" and "corporations" are as

defined in the North Dakota Century Code.

5. "Expenditure" means a purchase, payment, distribution, loan, advance, deposit, or gift of money or property, except a loan of money from a bank or other lending institution made in the regular course of business, made for the purpose of influencing the nomination for election, or election, of any person to office. Expenditure also means a contract, promise, or agreement, express or implied, whether or not legally enforceable, to make any expenditure and includes the transfer of funds by a political committee to another political committee.
6. "Patron" means a person who owns equity interest in the form of stock, shares, or membership, or maintains similar financial rights in a cooperative corporation.
7. "Person" means an individual, partnership, committee, association, corporation, cooperative corporation, or other organization or group of persons.
8. "Political committee" means any committee, club, association, or other group of persons which receives contributions or makes expenditures for political purposes.
9. "Political party" means any association, committee, or organization which nominates a candidate for election to any office which may be filled by a vote of the electors of this state or any of its political subdivisions or legislative districts and whose name appears on the election ballot as the candidate of such association, committee, or organization.
10. "Political purpose" or "political purposes" means any activity undertaken in support of or in opposition to the election or nomination of a candidate whether the activity is undertaken by a candidate, a political committee, a political party, or any person.

SECTION 2. CAMPAIGN CONTRIBUTIONS BY CORPORATIONS,
COOPERATIVE CORPORATIONS, AND ASSOCIATIONS PROHIBITED -
VIOLATION - PENALTY.

1. No corporation, cooperative corporation, or association shall make a direct contribution:
 - a. To aid any political party, political committee, or organization.
 - b. To aid any corporation or association organized or maintained for political purposes.
 - c. To aid any candidate for political office or for nomination to such office.
 - d. For any political purpose or the reimbursement or indemnification of any person for money or property so used.
 - e. For the influencing of any measure before the legislative assembly, except in accordance with chapter 54-05.1.
2. Nothing in this section shall be construed to prohibit the establishment, administration, and solicitation of contributions to a separate and segregated fund to be utilized for political purposes by a corporation, cooperative corporation, or association. It shall be unlawful for:
 - a. The person or persons controlling such a fund to make contributions or expenditures utilizing money or anything of value secured by physical force, job discrimination, financial reprisals, or the threat of them; or utilizing money from dues, fees, treasury funds, or other money required as a condition of membership in an association, or as a condition of employment; or utilizing money obtained in any commercial transaction. Moneys from fees, dues, treasury funds, or money obtained in a commercial transaction may, however, be used to pay costs of administration of the fund.
 - b. Any person soliciting an employee, stockholder, patron, or member for a contribution to such a fund to fail to inform the employee or member of the political purposes of the fund at the time of

- the solicitation, or of the general political philosophy intended to be advanced through committee activities.
- c. Any person soliciting an employee or member for a contribution to such a fund to fail to inform the employee or member, at the time of the solicitation, of his right to refuse to contribute without any reprisal.
 - d. Any contribution to be accepted without keeping an accurate record of the contributor and amount contributed, and of amounts expended for political purposes.
 - e. Any contribution to be accepted from any person who is not an employee, stockholder, patron, or member of the corporation, cooperative corporation, or association maintaining the political committee.
3. All political committees formed for the purpose of administering the segregated fund provided for herein shall file a statement listing all contributions received of twenty-five dollars or more, showing the name and mailing address of each contributor of twenty-five dollars or more, and a listing of all disbursements made for political purposes, no later than October fifteenth of each calendar year with the office of the secretary of state.
- a. The form of all statements required by this Act shall be as prescribed by the secretary of state.
 - b. The secretary of state may arrange an audit of any statement filed pursuant to this Act. The secretary of state shall arrange an audit of any statement that the attorney general requests to be audited. The results of the audit shall be reported to the attorney general.
 - c. Records and statements shall be preserved by the secretary of state for a period of four years from the date of filing. The records and statements are public records and shall be open

to public inspection.

4. No person shall make a payment of his own money or of another person's money to any other person for a political purpose in any name other than that of the person who supplies such money, and no person knowingly shall receive such payment nor enter nor cause the same to be entered in his account or record in any name other than that of the person by whom it actually was furnished.
5. If an officer, employee, agent, attorney, or other representative of a corporation, cooperative corporation, or association makes any contribution prohibited by this section out of corporate, cooperative corporation, or association funds or otherwise violates the provisions of this section, it shall be prima facie evidence of a violation by the corporation, cooperative corporation, or association.
6. A violation of the provisions of this section may be prosecuted in the county where the contribution is made, or in any county in which it has been paid or distributed.
7. It shall be a class A misdemeanor for an officer, director, stockholder, attorney, agent, or representative of any corporation, cooperative corporation, or association to violate any of the provisions of this section, or to counsel or consent to any violation. Any person who solicits or knowingly receives any contribution in violation of the provisions of this section shall be guilty of a class A misdemeanor.
8. Any officer, director, stockholder, attorney, agent, or representative who makes, counsels, or consents to the making of a contribution in violation of this section shall be liable to the company, corporation, or association for the amount so contributed.

SECTION 3. PERSON NOT EXCUSED FROM TESTIFYING AS TO VIOLATION - PROSECUTION OR PENALTY WAIVED UPON TESTIFYING. No person shall be excused from attending and testifying or

producing any books, papers, or other documents before any court upon any investigation, proceeding, or trial for a violation of any of the provisions of this Act, upon the ground that the testimony or evidence, documentary or otherwise, required of him may tend to incriminate or degrade him. No person shall be prosecuted nor subjected to any penalty or forfeiture for or on account of any transaction, matter, or thing concerning which he may testify or produce evidence, documentary or otherwise, and no testimony so given or produced shall be used against him in any criminal investigation or proceeding.

SECTION 4. EXPENDITURES FOR OTHER PURPOSES. Nothing in this Act shall be construed to prohibit the exercise by corporations, cooperative corporations, and associations of the right to make expenditures and contributions for the purpose of promoting passage or defeat of initiated or referred measures, or for promoting any general political philosophy or belief deemed in the best interest of the employees, stockholders, patrons, or members of the corporation, cooperative corporation, or association other than a "political purpose" as defined by this Act.

SECTION 5. REPEAL. Section 16-20-08 of the 1979 Special Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code, 16-20-09 of the 1977 Pocket Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code, and sections 16-20-05, 16-20-10, and 16-20-12 of the North Dakota Century Code are hereby repealed."
