STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

The salaries and wages line item for the Division of Surplus Property is reduced by \$7,666 from the general fund for the removal of funds associated with the state funding of conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees.

The operating expenses line item is reduced by \$806 from the general fund to reflect legislative guidelines of nine percent per year.

This amendment changes the appropriation to be made to the Department of Accounts and Purchases rather than the Superintendent of Public Instruction.

The state shall share the cost of financing jail operations in the state beginning July 1, 198 Cost sharing shall consist of reimbursement to the city or county responsible for incarcerating a prisoner at a rate of fifty percent of the daily auditable costs of incarceration per prisoner with a maximum reimbursement of fifteen dollars per prisoner per day. The state agency designated shall reimburse each county or city responsible for incarceration upon receipt of the quarterly jail report. A city or county shall pay all costs incurred for prisoner incarceration at the time the costs are demanded by the jail administration. State general fund appropriations will be adjusted as necessary to conform with current costs.

The department of accounts and purchases shall have the responsibilit to:

- Coordinate and manage the distribution of the jail cost sharing funds to the counties and cities, and arrange for appropriate audit activities.
- Promulate rules pursuant to chapter 28-32 for implementing and administrating the cost sharing program. The rules shall be published in the North Dakota Administrative Code.
- Provide technical assistance to counties and cities in applying for jail cost sharing.
- Ascertain compliance with jail cost sharing criteria and state jail standards prior to and following cost sharing approval.
- Determine, based on jail density and jail cost factors, reimbursable costs per prisoner per day and required appropriations.

SECTION 5. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$1,642,000 or so much

thereof as may be necessary, to the department of accounts and purchases for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this Act for the biennium beginning July 1, 1981, and ending June 30, 1983.

"For the second time in five years, the NDSU-Bottineau Hockey Team has competed in the National Junior College Hockey Championship Tournament. To qualify for this national tournament, NDSU-Bottineau challenged the Minnesota Junior College Representative (Hibbing Community College) and won handily by the score of 7-4. Bottineau advanced to the semi-finals to play a strong DuPage Community College Team. DuPage of Glen Ellyn, Illinois, has a student population of 23,000 and was the defending national champion. Although NDSU-Bottineau lost the game in the last few minutes of the third period, they played extremely well and represented North Dakota in an outstanding manner. As a result of its performance throughout the year and in the national tournament, the NDSU-Bottineau Hockey Team ended its season as the Number 4 Junior College team in the nation.

"Approximately half of the team members are graduates of North Dakota high schools; one-fourth are Canadians (NDSU-Bottineau is ten miles from the U.S.-Canadian border); and the remainder are from out-of-state.

"NDSU-Bottineau is most widely known for its specialized technical programs in forestry, natural resources, and environmental studies. However, the national attention given to the College and the State due to the Hockey Team's performance is something all of us take pride in."
