SENATE AMENDMENTS TO HOUSE BILL NO. 1341

On page 1, line 1, after the words "A BILL" delete the remainder of the bill and insert in lieu thereof the following: "for an Act for a conditional transfer of funds to a state capital construction fund; and providing an appropriation for the construction, remodeling, and equipping of, or for additions to, buildings of state agencies, departments, and institutions.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE
STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. APPROPRIATION - TRANSFER. In the event that the amount of revenues deposited in the general fund of the state treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1981, exceeds \$350,000,000, the director of the department of accounts and purchases shall direct the state treasurer to transfer from the general fund to the state capital construction fund the sum of \$22,189,000, which is hereby appropriated, or so much thereof as may be necessary, or the amount by which the revenues deposited in the general fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1981, exceeds \$350,000,000, whichever is less. In the event that the revenues deposited in the general fund of the state treasury for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1982, exceed \$410,000,000, the director of the department of accounts and purchases shall direct the state treasurer to transfer from the general fund to the state capital construction fund the funds that are in excess of \$410,000,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the projects listed in section 2 of this Act for which funds were not previously transferred from the general fund to the capital construction fund, or the amount by which the revenues deposited in the general fund for the fiscal year ending June 30, 1982, exceed \$410,000,000, whichever is less. In addition to other transfers authorized by this section, if more than fifty percent of the amount appropriated in section 2 of this

Act for a specific facility, in priority order, is transferred from the general fund to the capital construction fund on the dates authorized in this section, the director of the department of accounts and purchases shall direct the state treasurer to transfer the additional amounts required to complete such facility, not to exceed the total appropriation of state funds for such facility as set forth in section 2. Funds transferred pursuant to this section shall be expended by the various agencies, departments, and institutions for the construction or addition, remodeling, and equipping of buildings in accordance with specific appropriation made by the legislative assembly in section 2 of this Act.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the state capital construction fund, the sum of \$22,189,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to the state agencies, departments, and institutions listed herein, for the construction and equipping of buildings and facilities, or the remodeling of buildings and facilities within the limitations hereafter stated in this section during the biennium beginning July 1, 1981, and ending June 30, 1983.

The construction or remodeling of a building or facility shall be allowed to commence if more than fifty percent of the amount appropriated in this section for such building or facility is available and has been transferred from the general fund to the state capital construction fund as provided in this Act. If on June 30, 1983, there are not sufficient funds in the capital construction fund to commence construction or remodeling of a building or facility in accordance with the provisions of this Act, such construction shall not be commenced and such funds shall be returned to the general fund. If on June 30, 1983, sufficient funds are in the capital construction fund to complete a building or facility in accordance with the provisions of this Act, but have not been paid out for all expenses to be incurred in completion of such building or facility, such funds as may be necessary to complete such project or projects shall remain in the capital construction fund until spent for such purposes. In addition to the appropriations and authorizations set forth in this Act, there is hereby appropriated to the state agencies, departments, and institutions listed herein, any moneys

available from federal or other sources to construct or remodel the buildings and facilities set forth in this Act. In no event shall any building or facility exceed the cost indicated in the column "state funds" except to the extent funds may be received from federal or other sources."

REMARKS IN THE JOURNAL

Rep. Whalen: "Mr. Speaker, I would like to speak on House Bill No. 1529, and request that my remarks be printed in the Journal, which request was granted."

Rep. Whalen: "Mr. Speaker, Members of the Assembly: I rise to discuss House Bill 1529. It is a good bill. It follows the same pattern of legislation as the Federal Government's fair dealings with the farmers of this great nation of ours. We have for years watched as the farm states received less than a fair deal. If food prices go up, it is the farmer who caused it. The cure is to lower the price the farmer receives. For everyone knows that the cost of labor to process those food items, or the fancy wrappers they display the food in, could not cause the price of food to go up. So as the farmer is the forgotten citizen because he is only 2% of the voting population, so do we here in North Dakota have our forgotten citizens, for there are only 1132 of them: the citizens of Billings County. Consider, if you will, a county that produces 40% of all the oil in the great state of North Dakota but has the lowest cap of all the counties that produce oil. With no more incentive to want to increase that oil production than a Russian farmer on a collective farm.

"Consider, if you will, a county that just this fall put running water and indoor bathrooms in half of their grade schools, while the other three schools have running children and a path to the outside two-holders. Tell your students in our colleges to give a thought now and then to those grade kids in Billings County when it is 20 degrees below and they are standing on the diving board of their new six million dollar play pen that we just appropriated the money for.

"Consider, if you will, a county that has 51% of its land owned by the State and Federal Government that pays no tax. But Billings County must maintain the roads in all the county; a county that is almost all badlands. This they could not do before and will not be able to do now.

"When I was a young boy growing up in Scranton, North Dakota, Johnson Fuel Company had an underground coal mine and electrical generating plant for a small portion of the Scranton area. The mine at this time used mules to pull the coal cars from the bottom of the mine to the tippie. During the summer months I would go over and talk to the miner that fed the mules into letting me help him. As any 9- or 10-year-old would do, I asked a lot of questions. I remember he told me, 'You have to feed these fellows pretty good, 'cause they do the hard work pulling those cars from the bottom of the mine to the tippie. If we don't keep them happy and healthy, that coal won't get to the top. And that coal ain't worth a damn down there in the bottom of the mine.' Members of the Assembly, that oil isn't worth a damn out there in the middle of the badlands if there aren't any roads to drive on to haul it out or maintain those wells.

"I have nothing against putting a cap on the revenue received by the counties. I feel this is needed, but I also feel that if they are producing an amount over their cap, they should receive a percent of the excess.

We have explained this formula to those who have the say so, and have been offered other amounts that are less than we as Legislators were asked to give our neighboring state of Minnesota for reciprocal agreements for schooling. I would hope that we will not treat Billings County like an illegitimate child and deprive her of what is justly hers. As she has given the most, she is receiving the least. This is unfair by anybody's standards. I hope we can see this and correct it. I know that the people of Billings County, who have never asked for much from the state but are now giving their all, would not want this Bill 1529 to be killed. Every county but theirs benefits from this bill. So whatever is to be, so be it. They do not have the votes to stop it. Thank you."

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

University of North Dakota

The salaries and wages line item for the University of North Dakota is reduced by \$1,418,498 from the general fund to delete funds for a noncontributory retirement plan. Salaries are further reduced by \$428,595 from the general fund to delete funds for 6.3 FTE faculty positions. The operating expenses line item is reduced by \$340,080 from the general fund to reflect an exemption from the severance tax for coal used for heating buildings and a reduced freight rate on coal.

The estimated income line item reflects a \$75 per student increase in tuition for the first year of the biennium and an additional \$50 increase the second year. The executive budget recommended a single \$100 increase for the 1981-83 biennium.

UND Medical Center

The salaries and wages line item for the UND Medical Center is reduced by \$707,408, of which \$530,652 is from the general fund and \$176,756 is from other funds, to delete funds for a non-contributory retirement plan. Salaries are further reduced by \$108,399 from the general fund to delete funds for 2 FTE positions: an associate professor of medicine and a photographer.

North Dakota State University

The salaries and wages line item for North Dakota State University is reduced by \$1,237,786 from the general fund to delete funds for a noncontributory retirement plan. Salaries are further reduced by \$408,186 from the general fund to delete funds for 6.0 FTE faculty positions. The operating expenses line item is reduced by \$240,000 from the general fund to reflect an exemption from the severance tax for coal used for heating buildings and a reduced freight rate on coal.

The estimated income line item reflects a \$75 per student increase in tuition for the first year of the biennium and an additional \$50 increase the second year. The executive budget recommended a single \$100 increase for the 1981-83 biennium.

State School of Science

The salaries and wages line item for the State School of Science is reduced by \$474,967 from the general fund to delete funds for a noncontributory retirement plan. Salaries are further reduced by \$156,899 from the general fund to delete funds for 2.7 FTE faculty positions. Salaries and wages are also reduced by \$26,725 from the general fund to delete funds for one FTE motor vehicle mechanic, which was added by the Senate. The operating expenses line item is reduced by \$108,000 from the general fund to reflect an exemption from the severance tax for coal used for heating buildings and a reduced freight rate on coal.

The estimated income line item is increased by \$292,500 to reflect an additional \$25 tuition increase for the first year and an additional \$50 tuition increase for the second year of the biennium. The executive budget recommended a single \$50 increase for the 1981-83 biennium.

Dickinson State College

The salaries and wages line item for Dickinson State College is reduced by \$190,419 from the general fund to delete funds for a noncontributory retirement plan.

The capital improvements line item is decreased by \$25,000.

The estimated income line item is increased by \$81,016 to reflect an additional \$25 tuition increase for the first year and an additional \$50 tuition increase for the second year of the biennium. The executive budget recommended a single \$50 increase for the 1981-83 biennium.

Mayville State College

The salaries and wages line item for Mayville State College is reduced by \$137,237 from the general fund to delete funds for a noncontributory retirement plan.

The equipment line item is decreased by \$25,000.

The estimated income line item is increased by \$31,635 to reflect an additional \$25 tuition increase for the first year and an additional \$50 tuition increase for the second year of the biennium.

The executive budget recommended a single \$50 increase for the 1981-83 biennium.

Minot State College

The salaries and wages line item for Minot State College is reduced by \$362,335 from the general fund to delete funds for a noncontributory retirement plan.

The capital improvements line item is decreased by \$25,000.

The estimated income line item is increased by \$189,323 to reflect an additional \$25 tuition increase for the first year and an additional \$50 tuition increase for the second year of the biennium. The executive budget recommended a single \$50 increase for the 1981-83 biennium.

Valley City State College

The salaries and wages line item for Valley City State College is reduced by \$173,083 from the general fund to delete funds for a noncontributory retirement plan. The operating expenses line item is reduced by \$15,000 from the general fund to reflect an exemption from the severance tax for coal used for heating buildings and a reduced freight rate on coal.

The capital improvements line item is decreased by \$25,000.

The estimated income line item is increased by \$92,621 to reflect an additional \$25 tuition increase for the first year and an additional \$50 tuition increase for the second year of the biennium. The executive budget recommended a single \$50 increase for the 1981-83 biennium.

State School of Forestry - Bottineau

The salaries and wages line item for the State School of Forestry is reduced by \$68,675 from the general fund to delete funds for a noncontributory retirement plan. The operating expenses line item is reduced by \$5,184 from the general fund to reflect an exemption from the severance tax for coal used for heating buildings and a reduced freight rate on coal.

The estimated income line item is increased by \$29,672 to reflect an additional \$25 tuition increase for the first year and an additional \$50 tuition increase for the second year of the biennium. The executive budget recommended a single \$50 increase for the 1981-83 biennium.

Forest Service

The salaries and wages line item for the Forest Service is reduced by \$27,181 to delete funds for a noncontributory retirement plan.

NDSU - State Toxicologist

The salaries and wages line item for the State Toxicologist is reduced by \$10,253 to delete funds for a noncontributory retirement plan.

UND Rehabilitation Hospital

The salaries and wages line item for the Rehabilitation Hospital is reduced by \$309,567 to delete funds for a noncontributory retirement plan.


Tuition Increases

Operating Expenses

The operating expense line item of the Health Department is reduced by \$536,698 resulting from the following adjustments:

1. The general fund amount of \$265,954 included for rent in the new office building which the Health Department will not need to pay is deleted.
2. An amount of \$46,041 is added which represents the operating moneys transferred from Senate Bill No. 2011 for the ICF/MR clerk position (\$34,531 in federal funds, \$11,510 in general funds).
3. An amount of \$75,226 (all federal funds) is added for professional fees to contract with the State Water Commission and the State Geologist for their effort toward the Health Department underground injection control program.
4. There is \$49,828 deleted in travel of which \$38,368 is federal funds and \$11,460 is general funds.
5. An amount of \$342,183 (all general funds) is deleted from subdivision 1, the total Health Department budget, but are included in subdivision 2 for the Division of Community Mental Health and Alcohol and Drug Abuse.

Data Processing

This amendment deletes \$97,648 from subdivision 1, the Health Department budget, which amount is included in subdivision 2, the appropriation for mental health and alcohol and drug abuse (all general funds).

Equipment

This amendment increases the equipment line item by \$13,949 which

results from the following adjustments:

1. An amount of \$1,478 is added for the ICF/MR position which is transferred from Senate Bill No. 2011 (\$1,108 federal funds, \$370 general funds).
2. An amount of \$30,000 (all general funds) is added for the purchase of a computer to maintain a billing and accounts receivable system for the laboratory. This amount was included in the executive budget.
3. An amount of \$17,529 is deleted from subdivision 1, the Health Department, but is included in subdivision 2, the appropriation for the Division of Community Mental Health and Alcohol and Drug Abuse (all general funds).

Grants

This amendment decreases the grants line item of the Health Department by \$530,654 resulting from the following adjustments:

1. For the improved child health program for the Standing Rock Indian Reservation, \$50,000 in federal funds is added to expand and improve maternal and child health care on the reservation.
2. The amount of \$580,654, of which \$12,772 is federal funds and \$567,882 is general funds, is deleted from subdivision 1, the total Health Department budget, but is included in subdivision 2, the appropriation for the Division of Community Mental Health and Alcohol and Drug Abuse.

Mental Health and Retardation and Human Service Centers

The line item amounts of \$8,964,014 for the mental health centers and \$2,091,982 for the human service centers are deleted and separate line item appropriations are included for each center; the mental health center appropriations are included in Senate Bill No. 2010 and the human service center appropriations are included in Senate Bill No. 2011. These appropriations include the estimated income amounts estimated by each center. Each center appropriation provides for the continuation of current operations at the present operating level except at the Southeast Mental Health and Retardation Center. It is the intent of the Legislative Assembly that the reductions in personnel come primarily from the area of administration.

Summary




