

"8. Before the issuing of a permit the department shall:
a. Cause to be published in major local newspapers of general circulation and broadcast over local radio stations notice of the department's intention to issue such permit, and

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- b. Transmit in writing notice of the department's intention to issue such permit to each unit of local government having jurisdiction over the area in which the facility is proposed to be located and to each state agency having any authority under state law with respect to the construction or operation of the facility.

If within 45 days the department receives written notice of opposition to the department's intention to issue a permit and a request for a hearing, or if the department determines on its own initiative, the department shall hold an informal public hearing (including an opportunity for presentation of written and oral views) on whether the department should issue a permit for the proposed facility. Whenever possible the department shall schedule the hearing at a location convenient to the nearest population center to the proposed facility. The notice shall contain the date, time, place, and subject matter of the hearing.

9. Any facility required to have a permit under this chapter is exempt from the permit requirements of chapter 23-29."

"SECTION 7. MONITORING, ANALYSIS, AND TESTING.

1. If the department determines, upon receipt of any information, that:
 - a. the presence of any hazardous waste at a facility or site at which hazardous waste is, or has been, stored, treated, or disposed of, or
 - b. the release of any such waste from a facility or site may present a substantial hazard to human health or the environment, the department may issue an order requiring the owner or operator of the facility or site to conduct any monitoring, testing, analysis, and reporting

with respect to the facility or site which the department deems reasonable to ascertain the nature and extent of the hazard.

2. In the case of any facility or site not in operation at the time a determination is made under subsection 1 with respect to the facility or site, if the department finds that the owner of such facility or site could not reasonably be expected to have actual knowledge of the presence of hazardous waste at such facility or site and of its potential for release, the department may issue an order requiring the most recent previous owner or operator of such facility or site who could reasonably be expected to have such actual knowledge to carry out the actions referred to in subsection 1.
3. Anyone who violates this section shall be subject to a civil penalty of five thousand dollars per day of violation."

SECTION 10. APPLICABILITY. The provisions of this

Act do not apply to:

1. Drilling fluids, produced water, and other wastes associated with the exploration, development, or production of crude oil or natural gas or geothermal energy;
2. Fly ash waste, bottom ash waste, slag waste, and flue gas emission control waste generated primarily from the combustion of coal or other fossil fuels;
3. Solid waste from the extraction, beneficiation, and processing of ores and minerals, including phosphate rock and overburden from the mining of uranium ore; and
4. Cement kiln dust waste;

except that when a waste disposal site for any of the above wastes is to be closed, the owner or operator shall file a plat of the disposal site with the register of deeds of each county

in which the facility is located, together with a description of the wastes placed therein."




