
BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. REVOLVING FUND FOR PAYMENT OF SCHOOL BUS ROUTE ANALYSES. Funds shall be made available to all school districts in the state from a revolving fund in the state treasury under the control of the state superintendent for analyses of school district school bus routes conducted by the engineering experiment station at North Dakota state university in Fargo. School districts may apply for moneys from this fund by submitting a written request to the state superintendent who shall file the request and either accept or reject it. If an analysis is completed for a school district using moneys from the revolving fund and the analysis shows a possible transportation cost savings to the district, the district shall be liable for repaying to the revolving fund the amount received by the district and used to pay for its analysis. The state superintendent shall be empowered to require that an analysis be performed for a school district if the superintendent believes that such an analysis would result in a transportation cost savings to the district sufficient to offset the cost of the analysis. The state superintendent may adopt rules concerning the application procedures under this section.

SECTION 2. APPROPRIATION. There is hereby appropriated out of any moneys in the general fund in the state treasury, not otherwise appropriated, the sum of \$180,000, or so much thereof as may be necessary, to the state treasurer for deposit in the revolving fund created by this Act, to be paid out, on loan or otherwise, at the direction of the superintendent of public instruction for analyses of school bus routes conducted by the engineering experiment station at North Dakota state university in Fargo. The moneys appropriated by this Act may be utilized only after all federal funds for these same services are depleted. No more than fifty analyses may be completed using federal or state funds, or both, in any single year of the biennium."


