The board of higher education is authorized to borrow from the board of university and school lands the sum of two three million two hundred sixty-five thousand dollars, or so much thereof as may be necessary, for the purpose of the section 1 unit purchase, section 2 committee implementation, and section 6 land sale. The loan from the board of university and school lands shall be for a term not to exceed ten years, but the amount of the loan, interest rate, and method of repayment are to be negotiated by the board of university and school lands and the board of higher education. The board of higher education is authorized to grant a security interest to the permanent fund of the common schools in the property to be acquired. The members of the state board of higher education shall not be held personally liable for repayment of any loan obtained under this section, and the board shall be liable for repayment only in the manner provided pursuant to this section.
