# POINT OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

# Senator Nething:

We are now concluding the 24th Legislative Day and by the 33rd Legislative Day we need to have all Senate Bills passed to the House. I want to report to you that the Senate will meet that schedule. We have 434 bills introduced into the Senate and 47 Resolutions for a total of 481. We have now taken final action on 293 of them with 188 to go. While this is not as many as the past session, it is nevertheless a terrific

workload. I want to commend each committee chairman and each committee member for their diligent efforts in fairly and impartially processing these bills through our Senate structure. February 17th, the 31st Legislative Day, is the day that all Senate Bills must be reported out of committee. I am happy to report to you — not only will each committee meet that deadline — but all of the 11 committees will have begun processing House Bills several days before that time. This is an example of what attention, diligence and discipline can do for the legislative process.

To avoid any House member misinterpreting my remarks, I want all of you to know that their workload involved considerable more bills than ours did — 218 more to be exact. There are also twice as many members in the House and naturally this will account for some of the duplications, but there are also the same number of legislative districts represented in each body which should help offset some of the total bills introduced. If we want to continue to have a citizen legislature, it is incumbent upon each of us to discipline ourselves and to introduce and support only those bills which deal with an interest good for all of North Dakota. It is that personal discipline which will be the key ingredient to retention of a citizen legislature because we can easily make enough extra work for ourselves to justify spending more time here.

While speaking of discipline, I also want to remind each of you that in dealing with the fiscal affairs of this state, we will need to exemplify and practice more dollar discipline than in any time in recent years. This is a result of additional dollars produced by an initiated measure. By doing so we will be able complete this legislative session with the full confidence of the citizens of North Dakota regarding our abilities to recognize and care for their best financial interests and still provide needed services.

As we conclude our work this week, I again want to thank each of you for your willingness to spend long hours of concentrated effort in handling our workload, and to also remind you of the continued discipline we must have towards management of the finances of this Great State.
