SECTION 5. NONCONTRIBUTORY RETIREMENT PLAN. For the agency named in this Act \$5,025 is included in the salaries and wages line item to fund a noncontributory employee retirement plan. The amount referred to in this section shall not be used for any purpose other than to fund a noncontributory retirement program for state employees. If the forty-seventh legislative assembly does not provide by statute for a noncontributory retirement program for state employees, such amount shall remain in the salaries and wages line item until such line item is canceled on July 30, 1983."

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

The salaries and wages line item for the Council on Human Resources is decreased by \$187,827 by adding \$7,101 for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium; and by subtracting \$194,928 from the general fund to delete the following six positions: three secretaries, a legal assistant, a resident advocate, and an advocacy trainer. The salaries and wages line item of \$159,910 includes \$5,025 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees.

The amendment provides that the human service program administrative position in the developmentally disabled advocacy program be funded entirely by a \$100,000 federal grant with \$53,703 for salaries and wages and \$46,297 for the developmentally disabled advocacy program operating expenses.

The operating expense line item is reduced by \$87,187 by deleting \$25,073 for the Commission on the Status of Women and by subtracting \$58,391 from the developmentally disabled advocacy program and by subtracting \$3,723 to reflect legislative guidelines of nine percent per year.

The equipment line item is reduced by \$2,500 for the six positions deleted.



STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

Highway Patrol

Salaries and wages of the Highway Patrol are increased by \$289,916 to provide funds for the continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. The salaries and wages line item amount of \$7,012,709 includes \$225,126 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees. Operating expenses are reduced by \$77,030 to reflect legislative guidelines of nine percent per year. The \$61,819 decrease to operating expenses is due to a reduction in automotive fuel. Funds are allowed to provide for an average price per gallon of gasoline of \$1.60 the first year of the biennium and \$1.99 the second year of the biennium.

Law Enforcement Training Center

Salaries and wages of the Law Enforcement Training Center are increased by \$9,057 to provide funds for continuation of the 10 percent emergency salary increase and for salary increases of nine percent for the first year of the biennium and eight percent for the second year of the biennium. The salaries and wages line item amount of \$243,798 includes \$4,863 for the state to fund a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees. Operating expenses are reduced by \$4,325 to reflect legislative guidelines of nine percent per year.

House Bill No. 1174. — A Bill for an Act to create and enact five new sections to chapter 23-20.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the regulation and control of ionizing radiation resulting from uranium mining, processing, and related waste disposal; and to amend and reenact section 23-20.1-01, subsection 1 of section 23-20.1-04, and section 23-20.1-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition of terms and the collection and appropriation of fees for the issuance of licenses and registration certificates for sources of ionizing radiation; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources.

House Bill No. 1186. — A Bill for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 49-02-02 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to commission cooperation with the federal government on pipeline safety regulation; and to amend and reenact sections 49-02-01.2 and 49-07-05.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to commission jurisdiction of pipeline safety and violations of pipeline safety standards; and to provide penalties.
