Senator Dotzenrod: Mr. President, I rise on a point of personal privilege and request my remarks be printed in the Journal.

I would like to have the members of the Senate meet and be introduced to someone that's with me today. Miss Lynn Brokaw is Miss Rodeo North Dakota. She is the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Jim Brokaw of Forbes, North Dakota. Before becoming Miss Rodeo North Dakota, Lynn first had to compete at the local level where she obtained the title of Miss Rodeo Ellendale. At the Ellendale contest, and at the North Dakota contest, Lynn was judged on her personality, appearance and horsemanship, with each counting as one-third of her score. She took the horsemenship award at both contests and feels that this will be her strongest division of the Miss Rodeo America contest.

Also she was judged on a speech given on herself and the girls were judged as they modeled western fashions. Lynn has attended the largest clothing market, the Denver Merchandise Mart in Denver, Colorado. From that market she has obtained jobs to model at markets in Billings, Montana; Spearfish, South Dakota; Minneapolis and Dallas, Texas; which will prepare her for the modeling she will have to do when she competes for the Miss Rodeo America title in December just prior to the National Finals Rodeo in Oklahoma City. She will be judged in the same three divisions as in the state pageant. Lynn's job is somewhat like ours in that as she travels she represents the State of North Dakota, only her representation is in the aspect of rodeo. During this year Lynn will travel throughout the State of North Dakota promoting, supporting and enhancing the sport of rodeo, and she says that so far she has enjoyed doing this and that she is proud to be representing the State of North Dakota.

House Bill No. 1014. - A Bill for an Act making an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the soldiers' home of the state of North Dakoła.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Appropriations.

House Bill No. 1024. - A Bill for an Act making an appropriation for defraying the expenses of the division of disaster emergency services of the state of North Dakota.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Appropriations

House Bill No. 1184. - A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact sections 44-08-04, 44-08-04.2, and 54-06-09 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to expense accounts and mileage and travel expenses of state officers and employees.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Federal Govenment.

House Bill No. 1197. — A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact section 39-06-27, subsection 4 of section 39-06-32, section 39-06-33, subsection 2 of section 39-06-37, subsection 1 of section 39-06.1-10, and section 39-20-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the sufficiency of evidence used by the highway commissioner for drivers license action, the adequacy of the commissioner's records for such action, and the sufficiency of the notice to drivers of impending or concluded drivers license decisions.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

House Bill No. 1227. — A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 7 of section 15-40.1-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to payment of foundation aid for kindergarten.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Education.

House Bill No. 1249. — A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact sections 57-24-12 and 57-24-24 of the North Dakota Century Code to provide twelve percent annual interest on delinquent property taxes and to delete obsolete references to the hail indemnity tax.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Political Subdivisions.

House Bill No. 1373. — A Bill for an Act to provide limitations on increases or forced reductions in property taxes levied by taxing districts for certain years; and declaring an emergency.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance and Taxation.

House Bill No. 1374. — A Bill for an Act to provide for the valuation of property at true and full value, providing for the assessment of property at varying percentages of true and full value, and providing for statements of full consideration; to amend and reenact sections 57-02-27 and 57-02-28, subsection 1 of section 57-13-04, and section 57-55-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the determination of true and full value, the basis for the computation of property taxes, the powers and duties of the state board of equalization, and the taxation of mobile homes; providing a penalty; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance and Taxation.

House Bill No. 1392. — A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact section 4-28-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the election, appointment, term, and meetings of wheat commission members.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

House Bill No. 1429. — A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact section 27-06-08 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to fees for court reporter transcripts.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

House Bill No. 1444. — A Bill for an Act to create and enact three new sections to chapter 38-08.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the filing of a surety bond before engaging in geophysical exploration and the issuance of an exploration permit; and to amend and reenact subsection 1 of section 38-08.1-01 and sections 38-08.1-02, 38-08.1-03, 38-08.1-04, 38-08.1-05, and 38-08.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to definitions, persons required to comply with certain requirements, filing a notice of intention to engage in geophysical exploration, filing a record of work performed, and the duty to plug drill holes.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources.

House Bill No. 1447. — A Bill for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 57-15 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to a township mill levy for the purchase and operation of mowing or snow removal equipment.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

House Bill No. 1489. — A Bill for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 38-16 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the reclamation of lands affected by surface mining operations and providing a civil penalty for failure to reclaim affected lands.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources.

House Bill No. 1501. — A Bill for an Act providing for the regulation of propane exploders; and providing a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Agriculture.

House Bill No. 1547. — A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact section 27-20-04, subsection 1 of section 27-20-16, and sections 27-20-28 and 27-20-35 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to juvenile court concurrent jurisdiction of proceedings to treat or commit a mentally retarded or mentally ill child, place of detention, child investigation and report, and disposition of a mentally ill or retarded child; and providing for juvenile court concurrent jurisdiction of proceedings to treat or commit an alcohol or drug abusing child.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Social Services and Veterans Affairs.

House Bill No. 1561, -A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 7 of section 15-40.1-08 of the North Dakota Century Code to allow foundation payments to approved out-of-state kindergarten programs.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Education.

House Bill No. 1593. — A Bill for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 26-29 of the North Dakota Century Code, requiring a fire and property insurance rating organization to maintain an office within the state.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Industry, Business and Labor.

House Bill No. 1615. — A Bill for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 57-38.2 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to qualified plan income averaging for income tax purposes; to amend and reenact subsection 8 of section 57-37.1-01, and sections 57-38.2-02 and 57-38.2-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to updating the federalization of the state estate tax, qualified plan income averaging; and rules and regulations for the administration of income averaging; and providing an effective date.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Finance and Taxation.

House Bill No. 1618. — A Bill for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 54-44-04 and two new sections to chapter 54-44 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to placing responsibility for distribution of federal and state surplus property in the department of accounts and purchases; and to repeal chapter 15-61 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the personnel, powers, and duties of the division of surplus property of the department of public instruction.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Federal Government.

House Bill No. 1637. — A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15-51-12, 15-51-14, 15-51-15, 15-51-16, and 15-51-22 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to powers and duties of the Fargo school district board of education, providing for the appointment by the Fargo board of education of a board treasurer.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Education.

House Concurrent Resolution No. 3030. — A concurrent resolution urging Congress to control grasshopper infestation on federal lands.
