SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 40-40-06 of the 1979

Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

40-40-06. NOTICE OF PRELIMINARY BUDGET STATEMENT CONTENTS - HOW GIVEN. After the governing body has prepared
the preliminary budget statement, the auditor of the
municipality shall give notice that:

- The preliminary budget is on file in the office of the auditor and that such budget may be examined by anyone requesting to do so;
- 2. The governing body shall neet at the time and place specified in the notice as prescribed by subsection 3 for the purpose of adopting the final budget and making the annual tax levy, but no later than the first Wednesday in August October first and
- 3. The governing body shall hold a public session at such time and place designated in the notice of hearing at which any taxpayer may appear and discuss with such body any item of proposed expenditures or may object to any item thereof or to the amount of any such item.

The notice shall contain a statement of the total proposed expenditures under each group provided for in the preliminary budget and of the total proposed expenditures under all such groups, but need not contain any detailed statement of the proposed expenditures. Such notice shall be published at least once, not less than six days prior to the budget hearing, in a newspaper published in the municipality, if there is one, and if no newspaper is published in the municipality, the notice shall be published not less than six days prior to such meeting in the official city newspaper as provided by section 40-01-09.

SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 40-40-10 of the 1979

Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

40-40-10. CERTIFIED COPIES OF LEVY AND FINAL BUDGET SENT TO COUNTY AUDITOR. Immediately after the completion of the final budget and the adoption of the annual tax levy by the governing body of a municipality in accordance with the provisions of this chapter, and in no case later than September first October tenth, the auditor of the municipality shall send to the county auditor two certified copies of the levy as adopted and two certified copies of the final budget.

REMARKS OF MRS. MARIJO SHIDE INTERNATIONAL PRESIDENT OF THE GENERAL

FEDERATION OF WOMEN'S CLUBS

Mr. President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate and guests: Thank you. Thank you most particularly on behalf of the General Federation of Women's Clubs and the North Dakota Federation of Women's Clubs. My husband, Don Shide, our four children, Chuck, Dave, Dan, and Kate, my parents, Fred and Claudine Loomis, sister, Louise, brother, John Loomis Grand Forks, Larimore, UND, State of North Dakota UC, you're all my heritage. And Marijo Loomis Shide is nothing more than a reflection of the inspiration and the opportunities that you've given me. No one person is ever elected president of any organization. It's only the results of combined efforts of many people, their hard work, their inspiration, and many times, their sacrifices. So the honor given today is a reflection on you, and as such I say quite humbly, thank you for the great privilege and the honor of representing you here today.

I am president of the General Federation of Women's Clubs. As you know, no group has been more ridiculed in caricature than club women, but no group has contributed more vitality and variety to the cultural scene of the country. They rushed in where no angel would dare to put foot awing. They've prodded and they've pushed people into action for civic causes from the rural communities to the largest metropolitan areas, and every community with an active women's club bears witness to the success of GFWC. It's improved schools, libraries, health facilities, cleanliness, it's beauty, cultural advantages, and even it's industrial growth has most often been the result of the prodding of a GFWC Women's Club. I believe that you had this little booklet at

your desk. It's a thumbnail sketch of the organization.

Yes, we are the oldest organization of women. We are 91 years old. We have 12,000 clubs and 600,000 club women in the United States. We have clubs in 46 foreign countries for a total membership of 10 million, and so I serve as an international president. We are nondenominational, we're nonpartisan. And you know something else? The image of the club woman has changed, and we no longer make apologies for the cartoon character of the club woman of the past. She was a cartoon character, and I'm, sure you're too young, but anyway, she used to be in the Saturday Evening Post as a Helen Hogenson cartoon, and she'd stand up at the podium with a flowered hat and a gavel in her hand and she'd carry on the meeting with her mouth open. But her mind was closed, and we say that she's been replaced by the mini-skirted maxibrain club woman of today whose picture is holding a blueprint instead

of a teacup, and the blueprint that she holds is a mold for the 21st century. That's why GFWC blueprint with the 21st century is the administration's handbook for this organization these two years.

There are 90 documented service projects that you can do in your community. Club women are told it's a smorgasbord, you're supposed to pick and choose, you're not supposed to do it all. But there is one project in here I know every North Dakotan would be very proud of. The CPR, the Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation Project, the national chairman is LeAnn Pyle. Our goal is to train 12,000 CPR instructorsone in every club in the United States, and we're working to see that CPR is a part of high school requirements for education. You know, illness can wait but heart attacks can't, and LeAnn is a great chairman, and I know that we're very proud of her and the work that she's doing. We work in six areas: conservation, education, home life, international affairs, public affairs, and the arts. We're a volunteer service organization. We take that quite literally. Our national dues are \$1.00 a year. We give our backs, not our bucks, and we give our backs plenty because we documented over 17 million hours of volunteer time in the last two years that we've given. More than 10,000 communities in the United States take part in the Community Improvement Program, and Representative Dagne Olson would know that better than anyone for she served as president of the Manvel GFWC, a club with a community of 500 that went on to win nationally twice. Five thousand clubs participated in the home energy check and we distributed over five and one-half million home energy checks in this last year.

Did you know GFWC established 79 percent of the libraries in this country? You hear about Carnegie. Well GFWC, the General Federation of Women's Clubs, established 79 percent of the libraries in this country. Early in our organization were interested in legislation and we were responsible for the Pure Food and Drug Act, for Child labor laws, for workmen's compensation. And the emphasis today is back to legislation. And we're concerned about preserving the free enterprise system, preserve the great American bargain, and we lobby for the capital costs recovery act, a means for putting capital back into business and the revitalization of American industry. And we helped to

defeat the fair housing bill.

Thus was the bill that had a little section in it that said that a homeowner could be sued up to \$10,000 by HUD without a jury. And we lobbied for the Alaskan land bill, domestic violence and for national family week. I testified before committees. Probably one of the most exciting and interesting time I had, even though I didn't realize it then, was to testify before the Senate Foreign Relations Committee on the Panama Canal. It's increasingly interesting to me because that's the last time Hubert Humphrey ever appeared on that committee.

Something I'm particularly concerned about is something I think you are concerned about too and that is the fact that the American farmers are an endangered species. I think we need to recognize that, and I think we need to do something about it. I think the consumer needs to be told what the true picture of agriculture is. The index for insulation today is the grocery store. You know how much inflation is, you've been at the grocery store, you know what you paid for your groceries, that's what you hear when you're outside the consumer. We need to educate them to realize that only 16 to 17 percent of their disposable income is being paid for food. The largest subsidy being paid today is being paid by the American farmer to the consumer in the form of cheap food. We need to be concerned, when you get down to 3 to 4

percent of a population feeding the United States and the world, you're getting very close to a control, very close to a monopoly. If that comes, we're going to have a different kind of agriculture and we're not going

to have the surpluses that we have today.

Yes, I guess I am a part of the Washington scene. I flew here last night from Washington, and it was raining yesterday. North Dakota is where the good weather is. We have 25 members on our staff there, but the President is the chief executive officer. Most organizations of this size have strong executive directors and we do have one and the president is supposed to be a figurehead but in our organization the president is supposed to be there when the telephone rings and the tough questions come. She's to make the decisions and find the answers. When you're dealing with 10 million women in 46 foreign countries you find that you're working closely with the State Department, with the President, and with all the government agencies. It was a pleasure for me to be able to welcome the 100 inaugural visitors from North Dakota at our Historic headquarters. The headquarters is originally a mansion owned by Admiral Nelson who sold it to General Miles. General Miles was a friend of President Grant. President Grant used to walk down the street and sit in the drawing room and have a cigar and his niece was later married there. He served in the Uruguay and Czechoslovakian embassy and the General Federation of Women's Clubs bought this building in 1924. My office is on the third floor, and I live on the fourth floor so I have no excuses for being late to work in the morning. It is a little different working in Washington. I left one lock on the door at home on the farm. In Washington I have three locks on the door, a Wells Fargo system, and a panic button that I have in my desk at night. So the experiences in Washington are wonderful, but I'm truly pleased to be here, and I am pleased to have had the opportunity to represent an organization of volunteer service women. Service, as you know, is the rent that we pay for the privileges that we enjoy. So I am pleased to be there but home is where your heart is and my home is North Dakota and that's where my heart is, and I'm very proud of my heritage and I'm proud of my state. This is a state where citizens still have backbones in place of wishbones, for there is a basic integrity and industry that makes our young people the pride of our nation. This is where industry comes from the cream of the crop. I want to take a special privilege and present my husband, Don Shide. Please come forward and be recognized. And two shall become one. Representatives Olson, Gunderson, Senators Mutch, Tallackson and Cussons. Thank you. All of you. Members of the Forty-seventh legislative assembly. I appreciate very much the recognition given to the General Federation of Women's Clubs, to the North Dakota Federation of Women's Clubs, and to the Shide family today.

House Bill No. 1634. — A Bill for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 5 of section 49-22-08 and subsection 1 of section 49-22-13 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to public service commission designation of a site or corridor for an energy conversion or transmission facility and to public hearings on site, route, or corridor proposals.

House Bill No. 1635. — A Bill for an Act to provide counseling, guidance, job readiness training, and services for displaced homemakers; and to provide an appropriation.

House Bill No. 1648. — A Bill for an Act making an appropriation for defraying the expense of additional duties of lieutenant governor
