HOUSE AMENDMENTS TO SENATE BILL NO. 2070

On page 1, line 1, after the words "A BILL" delete the remainder of the bill and insert in lieu thereof the following: "for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 12 of section 26-41-03 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the definition of a motor vehicle owner for purposes of no-fault insurance requirements.

BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Subsection 12 of section 26-41-03 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

12. "Owner" means the person in whose name the motor vehicle has been registered. If ownership has been transferred, but the registration record has not been changed, "owner" means the person, other than a lienholder, to whom ownership has been transferred. If no registration is in effect at the time of an accident involving the motor

vehicle, "owner" means the person, other than a lienholder, who holds the legal title thereto, or in. In the event the motor vehicle is the subject of a security agreement ~~or~~ with the debtor having the right to possession, a lease with an option to purchase with the debtor- or a lessee having the right to possession, or a lease with a term of six months or more with the lessee having the right to possession, "owner" means the debtor or lessee."
