**Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4014.** — A concurrent resolution for the amendment of sections 3, 4, and 9 of article III of the Constitution of the State of North Dakota, previously designated as sections 3, 4, and 9 of article 105 of the amendments to the Constitution prior to publication of the renumbered Constitution, relating to signature requirements for petitions to initiate or refer measures or to initiate constitutional amendments.

Was read the second time and has committee recommendation of do not pass.

Senator Hanson moved that Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4014 be amended as follows:

On page 1, line 1, after the words "A concurrent resolution" delete the remainder of the resolution and insert in lieu thereof the following: "for the amendment of sections 3, 4, and 9 of article III of the Constitution of the State of North Dakota, relating to signature requirements for petitions to initiate or refer measures or to initiate

constitutional amendments.

STATEMENT OF INTENT

This amendment would lower the number of signatures required on petitions to initiate or refer measures from two to one and one-half percent of the population of the state and would lower the number of signatures required to propose constitutional amendments from four to three percent of the population of the state. A petition to initiate or refer a measure would have to be signed by at least one and one-half percent of the population in each of at least forty counties in the state and a petition to propose a constitutional amendment would have to be signed by at least three percent of the population in each of at least forty counties of the state. A petition signer would have to indicate his county of residence and his mailing address.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA,

THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the following proposed amendments to sections 3, 4, and 9 of article III of the Constitution of the State of North Dakota are agreed to and shall be submitted to the qualified electors of the State of North Dakota at the primary election to be held in 1982, in accordance with the provisions of section 45 of article IV of the Constitution of the State of North Dakota.

SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 3 of article III of the Constitution of the State of North Dakota is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Section 3. The petition shall be circulated only by electors. They shall swear thereon that the electors who have signed the petition did so in their presence. Each elector signing a petition shall also write in the date of signing and, his postoffice county of residence, and his mailing address. No law shall be enacted limited the number of copies of a petition. The copies shall become part of the original petition when filed.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 4 of article III of the Constitution of the State of North Dakota is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Section 4. The petition may be submitted to the secretary of state if signed by electors from at least forty counties in the state. The minimum number of signatures from each of these forty counties must be equal in number to two one and one-half percent of the resident population of the state county at the last federal decennial census, and the total number of signatures must be equal in number to one and one-half percent of the resident population of the state at the last federal decennial census.

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 9 of article III of the Constitution of the State of North Dakota is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

Section 9. A constitutional amendment may be proposed by initiative petition. If signed by electors equal in number to ~~four~~ three percent of the resident population of the state at the last federal decennial census, with a minimum number of signatures from at least forty counties in the state equal in number to three percent of the resident populations of those counties at the last federal decennial census, the petition may be submitted to the secretary of state. All other provisions relating to initiative measures apply hereto."

**POINT OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE**

Senator Tierney: Mr. President, I rise on a point of personal privilege and request my remarks be printed in the Journal.

Mr. President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, Dana Wheeler, a student at Concordia College, Moorhead, Minnesota represented the churches of the United States at a World Council of Churches meeting held February 28th through March 7th in Damascus, Syria.

He was asked to attend by Young Christians for Global Justice, an ecumenical organization of North American church youth groups. Dana was one of the organization's founders. He and a Canadian represented the churches of the North American continent.

The purpose of the meeting was to discuss relationships between church bodies and political governments, especially the relationship between Protestant and Orthodox churches. Between thirty and fifty people representing all areas of the world attended.

Dana, a sophomore at Concordia with a double major in communications and psychology, has been very involved in national church youth work since his senior year in high school. In 1979 he was elected national president of the national Luther League board, an advisory member of the council of district Luther League presidents, an advisory member of the American Lutheran Church's board for life and mission in the congregation and a member of the task force that restructured ALC youth ministry. A 1979 graduate of Maddock, N.D. high school, Dana is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Arthur Wheeler of Bismarck and I am very very proud and flattered that he would sit next to me. Mr. President, I would ask that the Senate now recognize Dana Wheeler.
