

1. No person shall be appointed as a dentist member of the board unless that person:
 - 1r a. Is a duly licensed and registered dentist.
 - 2r b. Is actively engaged in the practice of dentistry and has been so engaged in this state for at least five years immediately preceding his appointment.
 - 3r ~~Is recommended for such appointment by the North Dakota dental association~~
 - 4r c. Never has served as a member of the board for an entire five-year term.

~~At least ninety days before the expiration of a term of any member of the board, the North Dakota dental association shall make its recommendation to the governor. Not less than three candidates shall be recommended for each appointment. If the recommendations are not made in the required time, the governor shall make the appointment from the last recommendations of the association.~~

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2. No person shall be appointed as the dental hygienist member of the board unless that person:
 - a. Is a duly licensed and registered dental hygienist in accordance with the provisions of chapter 43-20.
 - b. Is actively engaged in the practice of dental hygiene and has been so engaged in this state for at least five years immediately preceding the dental hygienist's appointment.
 - c. Never has served as a member of the board for an entire five-year term.
3. The dental hygienist member of the board shall exercise full voting privileges in all areas with the following exceptions:
 - a. The issuance, suspension, and revocation of dental licenses.
 - b. Any disciplinary action taken against dentists.
 - c. The examination of dentists for licensure."

"NONAVAILABILITY OF FEDERAL BANKRUPTCY EXEMPTIONS.
In accordance with the provisions of section 522(b) of the Bankruptcy Reform Act of 1978 (Pub. L. 95-598; 92 Stat. 2586; 11 U.S.C. 522(b)), residents of this state shall not be entitled to the federal exemptions provided in section 522(d) of the Bankruptcy Reform Act of 1978. The residents of this state shall be limited to claiming those exemptions allowable by North Dakota law.

- ADDITIONAL BANKRUPTCY EXEMPTIONS.
In addition to the exemptions provided herein, a resident of the state may select:
1. In lieu of the homestead exemption, up to seven thousand five hundred dollars.
 2. A motor vehicle exemption not to exceed one thousand two hundred dollars.
 3. Accrued dividend, interest, or cash value of an unmaturred life insurance policy not to exceed four thousand dollars.

4. The debtor's right to receive, or property that is traceable to:
 - a. A payment, not to exceed seven thousand five hundred dollars, on account of the wrongful death of an individual of whom the debtor was a dependent, to the extent reasonably necessary for the support of the debtor and any dependent of the debtor.
 - b. A payment, not to exceed seven thousand five hundred dollars, on account of personal bodily injury, not including pain and suffering or compensation for actual pecuniary loss, of the debtor or an individual of whom the debtor is a dependent.
 - c. A social security benefit."

**CLARIFICATION OF THE PASSAGE
OF SENATE CONCURRENT
RESOLUTION NO. 4014**

President Sands:

In order to pass, Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4014 requires an affirmative vote of a majority of the members elected to the Senate.

This is specifically governed by Article IV, Section 45, of the Constitution of North Dakota (as renumbered) which states:

Any amendment or amendments to the constitution of the state may be proposed in either house of the legislature, and if the same shall be agreed to upon roll call by a majority of the members elected to each house, it shall be submitted to the electors and if a majority of the votes cast thereon are affirmative, such amendment shall be a part of this constitution.

The question has been raised whether Article III, Section 9, requires that there be a two-thirds vote of the Senate, since the constitutional provision dealt with by this Concurrent Resolution was approved by a vote of the people in 1978.

Article III, Section 9, relates to initiated and referred measures, and provides that such measures approved by the voters cannot be amended or repealed by the Legislative Assembly for seven years, except by a two-thirds vote of the members elected.

In my opinion, and consultation with the Attorney General and the Legislative Council staff, Article III, Section 9, does not apply to Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4014, for three reasons:

First, a constitutional amendment is by definition neither an initiated nor referred measure.

Second, the current constitutional provision, dealt with in the Concurrent Resolution, was not put to a vote of the people by initiative or referral action of the voters, but by a concurrent resolution adopted by the Legislative Assembly.

And third, by adopting this resolution, the Legislative Assembly would be neither amending nor repealing the previously adopted provision. The Legislature would be simply putting the matter before the voters for their decision.
