



Senate Concurrent Resolution No. 4088. — A concurrent resolution to create a new section of the Constitution of the State of North Dakota, relating to compensation for services for elected members or officials of all three branches of government; and to repeal section 46 of article IV and section 14 of article V of the Constitution of the State of North Dakota, relating to the salaries of legislators and public officers.

Board of Higher Education

The \$220,814 appropriation for heating costs at the institutions of higher education is deleted because of revised estimates due to the mild weather this winter.

Business and Industrial Development Department

The amount of \$20,554 is added for salaries for the new director of BIDD for the last six months of the 1979-81 biennium.

School for the Deaf

Estimated income is increased by \$45,000 from interest and income on school lands and the general fund appropriation is reduced by this same amount.

School for the Blind

Estimated income is increased by \$10,619 from interest and income on school lands, and the general fund appropriation is reduced by this same amount.

Grafton State School

The operating expense line item is reduced \$61,824 due to revised estimates of heating costs.

Soldiers' Home

The capital improvements line item is increased by \$6,250 from funds from the Soldiers' Home improvement fund for miscellaneous improvements. The estimated income line item is increased \$27,109 by adding \$20,859 from interest and income on school lands and by adding \$6,250 from the Soldiers' Home improvement fund.

Governor's Office

The fees and services line item is increased \$10,300 for Governor Olson transition costs. Also, \$5,000 is added for former Governor Link transition costs.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

Department of Accounts and Purchases

The salaries and wages line item for the Department of Accounts and Purchases is reduced by \$54,650, of which \$12,007 is from other funds and \$42,643 is from the general fund, to delete funds associated with the state funding a conversion to a noncontributory retirement plan for employees.

This amendment also deletes the \$1 million general fund appropriation for the statewide accounting and reporting system. 



1. The name and address of the landowner and of the person conducting the surface mining operation, and, if any of these are corporations or other business entities, the names and addresses of their principal officers and resident agent for service of process.

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2. The location of the surface mining operation by section, township, range, and county.
3. The date the surface mining operation was commenced.
4. The minerals mined by the surface mining operation.
5. A description of the surface mining operation.
6. The maximum depth of the surface mining operation.
7. The number of acres [hectares] affected by the surface mining operation for the calendar year covered by the report.
8. An estimate of the number of acres [hectares] to be affected by the surface mining operation during the calendar year next succeeding the report.
9. The cubic yardage [cubic meters] of mineral mined and overburden disturbed by the surface mining operation for the calendar year covered by the report.
10. An estimate of the cubic yardage [cubic meters] of mineral to be mined and overburden to be disturbed by the surface mining operation during the calendar year next succeeding the report.
11. A map of the affected land if more than ten acres [4.05 hectares] have been disturbed by the surface mining operation, or, regardless of the amount of land to be disturbed, if the committee finds that conditions warrant it and so requests a map. The map shall show the boundaries of the affected land, topographic detail, the location and names of all streams, roads, railroads, and utility lines on or immediately adjacent to the affected land, and the location of access roads built in conjunction with the surface mining operation.
12. The location of any segment of the affected land that will not be further disturbed by the surface mining operation.
13. The date of completion or abandonment of the surface mining operation, if completed or abandoned.
14. The date of beginning, extent, and current status of any reclamation activities performed during the period covered by the annual report or planned to be performed after completion or abandonment of the surface mining operation or any segment of the surface mining operation. The description of reclamation activities shall indicate which parts of the affected land are intended to be reclaimed for forest, pasture, crop, horticultural, homesite, recreational, industrial, or other uses, including food, shelter, and ground cover for wildlife, and shall show the same by appropriate designation on a reclamation map."
