#### FIRST READING OF HOUSE BILLS

Rep. Conmy introduced:

HB 1250: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 16.1-05-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to duties of the members of election boards; and to amend and reenact section 16.1-07-09 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the canvassing of mailed absent voters' ballots received late.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Rep. Gerl introduced:

HB 1251: A BILL for an Act to create and enact two new sections to chapter 54-42 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the organization, meetings, and compensation of the merit system council and federal grant-in-aid programs; and to amend and reenact subdivision a of subsection 1 of section 28-32-01 and section 54-42-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to agencies not included in the definition of administrative agencies and the composition of the North Dakota merit system council; and to repeal chapter 54-44.3 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the central personnel system.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Federal Government.

Rep. Thompson introduced:

HB 1252: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15-39.1-23 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to penalties for failing to make the required reports and payments to the teachers' fund for retirement.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Education.

Rep. Serenus Hoffner and Sen. Peterson introduced:

HB 1253: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact sections 15-20.1-08, 57-15-14, 57-15-52.1, and 57-16-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to passage of mill levies with an ordinary majority of approval by the voters.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Education.

Rep. Sanstead introduced:

HB 1254: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new paragraph to subdivision a of subsection 3 of section 39-06.1-10 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to assignment of points against motor vehicle operators for speeding violations; and to amend and reenact section 39-06.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the amount of statutory fees for speeding violations.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

Reps. Koski, Richard introduced:

HB 1255: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 11-33.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to special assessments in rural areas; and to amend and reenact sections 11-33.1-01, 11-33.1-03, and 11-33.1-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to special assessments in rural areas.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Political Subdivisions.

Rep. Halmrast introduced:

HB 1256: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new chapter to title 61 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the designation of the Missouri River as scenic, recreational, and free-flowing.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources.

Reps. O'Shea, Brokaw introduced:

HB 1257: A BILL for an Act to prohibit double employment by state employees; and to amend and reenact section 37-01-25 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to paid leave of absence for officers and employees of the state or political subdivisions.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Federal Government.

Rep. Black introduced:

HB 1258: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15-59-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to school districts providing special education.  
Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Education.

Reps. O'Shea, Hill introduced:

HB 1259: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subdivision o of subsection 2 of section 39-04-18 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to exemption from registration for certain motor vehicles owned by spouses of prisoners of war.

HB 1260: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 15-53.1-06 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to annexation hearings, equalization, and notice of hearings.
