SCR 4037: A concurrent resolutzon directing the Legislative Council to study methods of requiring annual payments in certain emınent domain proceedings.
Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Natural Resources.

SCR 4038: A concurrent resolution directing a Legislative Council study of the office of state's attorney.
Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Political Subdivisions.

SCR 4039: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study present land use planning and zoning laws. Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Political Subdivisions.
