BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

SECTION 1. A new subsection to section 57-02-08 of the North Dakota Century Code is hereby created and enacted to read as follows:

> group homes owned by nonprofit A11 corporations, not organized with a view to profit and recognized as tax exempt under section 501(c)(3) of the United States Internal Revenue Code, including those for persons with developmental disabilities, and the real property upon which they are located during the period in which the group homes are under construction or in a remodeling phase and while they are used as group homes. For the purposes of this subsection, the term "group home" means a community-based residential home which provides room and board, personal care, habilitation services, and supervision in a family environment, and which, once established is licensed by the appropriate North Dakota licensing authority.

SECTION 2. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Act is effective for taxable years beginning after December 31, 1982."
