Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Judiciary.

Sen Lodoen introduced:

SB 2263: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 21-09-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the validation of bonds and other evidences of indebtedness issued by public bodies of the state prior to July 1, 1983.
