This amendment provides for a temporary suspension of state revenue sharing in light of the current state fiscal crisis.

Every state agency, institution, department, board, bureau, commission, and the board of higher education and institutions under its jurisdiction unless exempted by the commissioner must use the system. An appropriate charge based on actual costs will be made for such services.

Each entity required to use the system must submit records of the operation of each vehicle as

- directed by the commissioner. The commissioner is authorized, within the limits of legislative appropriation, to employ personnel necessary to carry out the duties prescribed by this section."

- SECTION 1. AMENDMENT. Section 57-39.2-04 of the 1981 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:
- 57-39.2-04.1. Sales tax exemption for food and food products. Beginning July 17 1973, gress Gross receipts from sales for human consumption of food and food products including but not limited to cereal and cereal products, butter, cheese, milk and milk

products, oleomargarine, meat and meat products, poultry and fish and other fresh and saltwater animal products, eggs and egg products, vegetables and vegetable products, fruit and fruit products, spices and salt, sugar and sugar products including candy and confectionary products, chewing gum, coffee and coffee substitutes, tea, cocoa and cocoa products, and carbonated beverages when purchased by consumers for consumption off the premises where purchased, or when purchased from a coin-operated vending machine shall be exempt from the sales tax imposed by chapter 57-39.2. "Food" and "food products" as used herein shall not include any alcoholic beverages or mixed drinks made therefrom, or medicines and preparations in liquid, powdered, granular, tablet, capsule, lozenge, and pill form sold as dietary supplements or adjuncts."
