POINT OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

REP. MERTENS: Mr. Speaker: I rise on a point of personal privilege and request that my remarks be printed in the Journal.

Mr. Speaker and members of the Assembly: I think another important part you have to worry about in capping these transportation payments is that it really does an injustice to the school district that has tried to hold their transportation payments down. It locks the more efficient school districts in on their transportation and they may not be as successful the next year.

The Department of Public Instruction said that there really isn't any exact science as far as distributing the funds for transportation. They continually try to do it on a fair and equitable basis. Well, when you start going into a cap on those transportation payments, you do an injustice to those that have been remarkably efficient in the last few years. And, also the argument that you put it on foundation payments; I hope the rural areas will realize that you may indeed have decreases in the number of

students attending schools, and yet you have the same bus routes--probably more inefficient bus routes--so that's no trade-off at all.

Now, I think we should defeat the amendments to House Bill No. 1002 because it has about three specific amendments. It establishes a salaries-and-wages package that a number of people in this body do not agree with. A number of people in this body do not agree with the foundation aid payments, and the transportation issue in not agreeable. By adopting these amendments, you would be saying "yes" to all three of those. I think this is a dangerous precedent. I hope you will vote "no" against the amendments.

Governor's Council on Human Resources

The salaries and wages line item is increased by \$1,151 from the general fund. Of this net increase a reduction of \$4,854 will allow funds for average salary increases of 5.5 percent the first year of the biennium (these funds are to continue the cost of an average increase of 5.5 percent on May 1, 1985) and average salary increases of four percent the second year of the biennium. Funds are allowed to provide a minimum increase of \$50 per month for each year of the biennium. The salary increases are to based on merit, performance, or equity adjustments, and are not intended to be across-the-board salary increases. In addition, \$6,005 is added to provide additional salary moneys for the executive director.

State Hospital

Subdivision 3 is added which provides funding for the State Hospital in House Bill No. 1009.

The salaries and wages line item as originally included in House Bill No. 1010 is reduced by a net reduction of \$527,748 of which \$517,688 is from the general fund and \$10,060 is from other funds. A reduction of \$670,642, \$660,582 from the general fund, will allow funds for average salary increases of 5.5 percent the first year of the biennium (these funds are to continue the cost of an average increase of 5.5 percent on May 1, 1985) and average salary increases of four percent the second year of the biennium. Funds are allowed to provide a minimum increase of \$50 per month for each year of the biennium. The salary increases are to be based on merit, performance, or equity adjustments, and are not intended to be across-the-board salary increases. In addition, \$192,026 from the general fund is added for six additional FTE, four Mental Health Care Specialists and two Social Worker III's. Also \$49,132 from the general fund is deleted for 1.5 FTE librarian positions.

The data processing line item is reduced by \$60,000 from the general fund.

The capital improvements line item is increased by \$912,000 from the general fund for air conditioning of the adolescent center and the receiving and treatment center.

A new section is added to allow the department to develop a staff training and stipend program within available moneys in the salaries and wages line item not to exceed \$322,000.

A new section is added to allow the Emergency Commission authority to transfer amounts appropriated to Grafton State School and San Haven to the Department of Human Services to match additional federal Medicaid funds in excess of the amount appropriated in Section 1 of House Bill No. 1009.
