ELECTION OF PRESIDENT PRO TEM SEN. WRIGHT: Mr. President, I move Senator Chester Reiten to the position of President Pro Tem of the Senate.

Mr. President, Senator Chester Reiten has been a member of the North Dakota state Senate since the 1973 Session. He has served on the Industry, Business, and Labor Committee since coming to the Senate and has been chairman of the committee for the past four sessions. Senator Reiten has also been Mayor of the city of Minot for thirteen years. He also serves as Chairman of the Board of the Trinity Hospital at Minot. Senator Reiten is in the radio and television business. He currently is president and owner of four television stations in the central and western portion of the state of North Dakota. Before becoming involved in the broadcasting business, Senator Reiten was a county agent in Wells County, North Dakota. Mr. President, as I said before, it gives me great pleasure in placing the Honorable Senator Reiten as President Pro Tem of the North Dakota Senate this Forty-ninth Session.

SEN. MATCHIE: Mr. President, I would like to move the nomination of Senator Herschel Lashkowitz from our party for the position of President Pro Tem of the North Dakota Senate.

Mr. President, Senator Lashkowitz is known to you all, perhaps better than most of us. He is a good lawyer, a thorough politician, and a great human being. Senator Lashkowitz has been involved in major politics in North Dakota since the 1950's. He is a long-time leader in city government, and he has been involved in the North Dakota Senate since the mid-60's. Senator Lashkowitz is, I think, a person of government.
