POINT OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

Madam President, ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, I would like to make a few comments on SB 2038. I would like to say that without a two-thirds vote of the Senate, the employees will not receive their pay back to April first until after July first. The law will be enforced, the payment would be made after July 1.

I'd like to also say that the budget office or the tax commissioner has not seen possible to furnish us, the majority party, any revenue estimates. We do not have any information, other than what's in the budget book and was prepared by Governor Olson and presented to us in the orientation session in December.

Now, we think we are part of this legislature and should also have privy to the estimates of revenue. We certainly want to have them just as soon as we possibly can. I've asked the budget office on numerous occasions that we be furnished with that information, and they always put it off another week or another two weeks. And here we are, we've got maybe five or six weeks of the session left, and we do not have any new revenue projections for the fiscal period 1985-87.

POINT OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

SEN. NAADEN: Madam President: I rise on a point of personal privilege and request that my remarks be printed in the Journal.

Madam President, Ladies and Gentlemen of the Senate, it was my pleasure, along with Senator Meyer, to attend a National Conference of State Legislators in Washington, D.C., this past week. We were selected as members of the Agricultural Committee of that body and we were there to deliberate resolutions to form a policy for the next two years for that association. It was a very productive meeting. I guess it was probably the largest meeting of that particular committee that the association has ever had. We met with a number of legislators from Congress, mostly senators. We did have a visit with our delegation from the state of North Dakota; Senator Burdick, Senator Andrews and Congressman Dorgan. The final draft of our policy has not been drawn; resolutions were presented that were quite hard to follow and so I will distribute those to the senators when we do receive them. We heard from Senator Dole who is the Majority Leader in the Senate; he did explain to the group as to what the program will be for providing money for FMHA in the ensuing months. He guaranteed us without a question of a doubt that there would be adequate money to finance the FMHA borrowers this spring. He also said that we will keep on top of it; we will have the money out here in a timely manner so that the farmers in the country will be able to put their crops in. He was very emphatic about that. If you've ever met Senator Dole, you will know that he would mean what he says and says what he means.

We had a very nice visit with Secretary Block. He explained the program. He said what he presented to the public and to the Congress last Friday might not be etched in stone, but that it is a direction that the Secretary of Agriculture and the Administration would like to take concerning farm programs.

We found, as you find here in the state of North Dakota, that the senators and representatives are faced with these tough decisions of who is going to get what part of the pie. It's no different down there than it is right here. We've had to turn as many people down in the legislature here just as they are in the Congress today, trying to balance that budget. I hope that everybody realizes that. We did attend the session in the House Tuesday afternoon and who should we see on the floor but former Senator Grotberg's brother--John Groberg. He is now a member of the United States House of Representatives. It was a very enjoyable, I think, and a very productive meeting in Washington as many of the rest of them that went down there will attest to.

Now I would like to yield to Senator Meyer.

POINT OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

SEN. W. MEYER: Madam President: I rise on a point of personal privilege and request that my remarks be printed in the Journal, which motion prevailed.

Madam President, Members of the Senate:

I, as well as Senator Pete Naaden, was asked, as members of the North Dakota Senate, to represent you at the National Conference of State Legislators in Washington, D.C., this past weekend. I would like to share with you some of the views and concerns that we shared along with 26 other states. I have prepared remarks that I will share with you.

We have a serious problem in agriculture that must be addressed. Let's react to the problem, but let's be very careful not to overreact. We've gone through crises before and made it and we will again.

A lot of people say we will lose the family farm. I don't believe we will. We are going through a shakedown. When all is said and done, the family farm will be here as strong and as efficient as ever. We are survivors.

I feel I was elected by the people to represent the majority's interest. From all the mail and telephone calls I have received from my constituents, I feel the majority of the farmers are opposed to bailouts, buydowns, or other short-term solutions to long-term problems.

It appears to be very difficult to address one group of farmers' problems without affecting another group or tier of farmers.

A lot of people feel that part of the group in trouble are in trouble at their own expense; that some people in trouble are in trouble because they bid up the price of land or lease so that they couldn't compete, and now they have the opportunity that that group is no longer competing with them to buy or rent the land that they couldn't compete with; and at the same time are being asked to bail out the person that caused the problems.

I guess what I am trying to say is the group that is in trouble has a serious problem which has also become our problem. I don't believe it can be ignored and will go away. It must be addressed without the person that had nothing to do with the problem being penalized or paying for someone else's mistake.

The reason I'm saying it is our problem is that if we don't address it, many innocent people will be hurt. How many bankruptcies can our small town implement dealers, stores,

suppliers of fuel, fertilizer, credit unions, banks, etc., stand without bankrupting them. These businesses operate on our money as well as theirs. In my opinion, at this point, this problem becomes our problem.

It is our money in those banks that this group borrowed from. If we simply leave this group fall, it is your bank, your money, that you are saying leave fall. I would like to also rent more land or buy some more; but like I stated earlier, there is no easy or simple solution to this problem.

We have the farm credit counseling program to help farmers through these trying times. It is not a solution to their problem, but if, through counselors, we can help give them some peace of mind; be it getting them together with their creditors, finding a solution to their problems, or just simply helping them find a gracious way out; it must be done. How do you put a value on saving a family or if you just prevent one suicide.

We must address the tax problem. It is not right that you cannot afford to go broke without owing the government alternative tax to be carried with you even through bankruptcy.

For example, if you bought your land for \$100 an acre, and you accumulated \$300-an-acre debt, if your creditor buys back this land for the debt that is against it at the foreclosure sale, you must pay capital gains tax on that \$200. If you had enough loss to carry forward, which you probably will, you would owe no tax, but the government says you cannot deduct all the tax. You must pay an alternative tax which is fine if you developed the land or through speculations, when land values were increasing, you made a lot of money, but now that you are broke, you can't even lose it. We must have the Internal Revenue Service address this problem and correct it. This again will not cost money.

There are a lot of ways that FHA has as far as debt restrictions.

Secretary Block has promised all funding necessary to help get the crop in this spring and enough field staff to process loans.

There appears to be considerable amount of support as far as advances on C.C.C. loans. This would cost the government very little money because the farmer would be paying the interest on loans at government cost. There doesn't need to be any legislation on this, being money is already appropriated. It could be released immediately.

There appears to be support for increased release of target price funds.

In my opinion, the biggest weakness we have, as has always been agriculture's No. 1 enemy, is our inability to work together as a group, to stand united until we can accomplish the goal that we are all working for, but try to accomplish it by all going our own way.

My solutions are only a partial solution. In my opinion, our problems could be easily solved by lower interest rates and more for our products.

I guess if I had the solutions to these problems, my job would be finished.

When the transaction relating to the sale of said the bonds is to be consummated, there shall be delivered to the registering recording officer a detailed financial statement of the municipality given by the treasurer auditor, clerk, or secretary of the municipality under oath. When such the bonds have been fully registered recorded as required by this section, and when he the recording officer has received such the detailed financial statement of the municipality, the registering recording officer shall sign an endorsement on the back of each bond certifying that such the bond is registered fully recorded in his that office, and, if such is the truth, that such the bond is issued in accordance with law and is within the debt limit of the municipality issuing the same bond. No bond shall be valid without such the certificate endorsed thereon. When the bonds have been so registered and certified, such registering and certifying officer shall deliver the same to the purchaser thereof in accordance with the terms of the resolution awarding their sale, and shall forthwith transmit the proceeds thereof to the treasurer of the municipality.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 21-03-23 of the 1983 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

21-03-23. Bond register record. The county auditor shall keep a bond register record in which shall be entered, as to each issue of bonds issued by a taxing district in the county required by the provisions of section 21-03-22 to be delivered to the county auditor after execution, a record of the date of issuance, the aggregate amount authorized, the aggregate amount issued, the number of bonds and the denomination of each, the date of maturity of each bond, the rate of interest, the amount of the levy on taxable property for each year certified by the taxing board, the amount levied on any other object of taxation by the municipality, the amount pledged or allocated from other sources of revenue of the municipality, and the amount of any annual or periodic payments or distributions appropriated or allocated by the legislative assembly. Such bond register also shall contain similar information regarding each issue of certificates of indebtedness of each taxing district in the county. The state auditor shall prescribe for the use of the county auditors a uniform form of bond register."
