EXPLANATION OF VOTE - HB 1645

SEN. WALDERA: Madam President, I rise to explain my vote.

Madam President, members of the Assembly, I had misgivings about voting red on the questions and on the final passage

of this bill because I understand, as we all understand, the tremendous contributions these individuals have made to the history of our State.

I would have voted differently, I'm sure, if the selection of these individuals had been made by a bipartisan people's committee in conjunction with the State Historical Board. I would have voted differently. But I can see in the Fiftieth General Assembly where we are going to have a great many bills probably for statuary on the Capitol grounds. I was just sitting here reminiscing about North Dakota history in my mind and I can think of at least ten individuals, I think, who merit consideration for statuary placement on the Capitol grounds. So, I wanted to express my feelings, Madam President. I didn't vote against these people because I didn't think they merited consideration. They most certainly did. Their contributions have been extensive; commendatory. I objected, though, to the process by which they were selected. I wish there had been more citizens' input into the selection. And I hope in the future that we will have such a bipartisan people's commission working in conjunction with the State Historical Society. Thank you.
