## REQUEST BY THE SPEAKER

**SPEAKER KLOUBEC REQUESTED** that the Rules for Decorum in the House Chamber be printed in the Journal, which request was granted.

# RULES FOR DECORUM IN THE HOUSE CHAMBER

- 1. No food or liquids are allowed on the floor while the House is in session.
- 2. Smoking is allowed in the Chamber only when the House is not in session.
- Flash camera pictures may not be taken at any time, except by the press.
- 4. Employees are instructed to allow no one to sleep or rest in a prone position in the seats that line both sides of Memorial Hall between the Chambers.

- 5. When a vote is to be taken, every member, except for the Majority and Minority Leaders and their assistants, shall be in the member's seat and register the member's own vote.
- During debate on legislation, members are to be attentive and quiet and the noise behind the rail must be held to a minimum.
- 7. Members are reminded of House Rule 351(3), which states that no member may have more than one guest seated with the member on the floor at any one time.
- 8. Legislators and visitors will not be allowed to visit or lean over the back railing.
- 9. Members are reminded of House Rule 205(3) which states that the Sergeant-at-Arms shall clear the floor of the House Chamber in front of the railing of all persons except legislators, legislative guests, legislative employees, and members of the press, during the time period commencing thirty minutes before the House convenes on any legislative day until the House recesses for that calendar day.
- Legislators and employees are expected to be suitably attired.
- 11. When the Speaker is putting the question, no member may walk out of or across the House. When a member is speaking, no member may pass between the person speaking and the Chair.
- 12. A member desiring to speak shall rise and respectfully address the Speaker and shall remain in place before proceeding to speak until recognized by the Chair.
- Visitors sitting in lower tier of seats in House Balcony must not touch or put their feet on brass railings.
- 14. The Sergeant-at-Arms should at all times be watching those visitors in their areas so they do not throw anything over the railing or lean over the railing.
- 15. On any question or problem, contact the Sergeant-at-Arms or his Deputy at once.
- 16. Bring to the attention of the Sergeant-at-Arms or one of his assistants immediately any problems with visitors which are contrary to the decorum of the House.

17. Permission to take group pictures must be requested from the Chief Clerk of the House, and may be allowed only at his discretion.
