SB 2520: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact subsection 6 of section 15-27.2-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to credit for residents of annexed school districts that have surplus funds prior to the annexation.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Committee on Education**.

SB 2523: A BILL for an Act making an appropriation for defraying the expenses of various elected officials of the state of North Dakota; to provide for transfers; to create and enact a new section to chapter 18-01 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to fire safety inspections performed by the fire marshal at the request of the department of human services; and to amend and reenact section 49-18-41.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to fees charged by the public service commission.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Committee on Appropriations**.

SB 2535: A BILL for an Act to establish a health care data committee as a standing committee of the state health council for the collection, analysis, and public distribution of information regarding the costs and prices charged for health care services in North Dakota, to ensure that health care purchases by state agencies are made in a more cost effective manner, and to provide for the collection of fees; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Committee on State and Federal Government**.

SB 2536: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 54-44.1 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the apportionment of reductions in spending authority resulting from an initiative or referendum.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Committee on Judiciary**.

SB 2537: A BILL for an Act to provide for the establishment of the department of protection and advocacy for persons with developmental disabilities and persons with mental illness, its duties and responsibilities; and to provide a penalty.
