# BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY OF THE STATE OF NORTH DAKOTA:

**SECTION 1. AMENDMENT.** Subsection 1 of section 43-43-01 of the 1985 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

1. "Advisory board" means the following or their appointed agents: secretary of state health officer as chairperson, the director of the state laboratories department, the state health officer commissioner of the North Dakota department of agriculture, and the president of the North Dakota environmental health association. The secretary of state health officer shall appoint environmental health practitioner and one consumer.

SECTION 2. AMENDMENT. Section 43-43-03 of the 1985 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

43-43-03. Advisory board duties and compensation. The advisory board shall meet at the request of the secretary of state <u>health officer</u> to assist in implementation of duties as defined in section 43-43-04. The advisory board shall be reimbursed for any necessary expenses, but shall serve without further compensation except as may be authorized and fixed by the secretary of state <u>health officer</u> by rule.

SECTION 3. AMENDMENT. Section 43-43-04 of the 1985 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

43-43-04. Powers and duties of secretary of state health officer. The secretary of state health officer shall adopt rules consistent with and necessary for the implementation and enforcement of this chapter, including rules concerning the:

- 1. Qualifications and requirements for licensure under this chapter.
- 2. Application for licensure and renewal of license.
- 3. Licensure.
- Fees that may not exceed fifty dollars for licensure fees.
- 5. Scope of practice.

- 7. Continuing competency and education requirements.
- 8. Grievances and complaints.
- 9. Reimbursement of advisory board expenses.
- 10. Emergency exemptions as to requirements for licensure under this chapter.

SECTION 4. AMENDMENT. Section 43-43-05 of the 1985 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

43-43-05. Exception from requirements. The secretary ef state <u>health officer</u> must license all persons actually engaged in the practice of environmental health in this state upon receipt of proof of a bona fide practice in this state; however, the applicant must file an application and present such proof prior to July 1, 1986, or become subject to licensure requirements of this chapter.

**SECTION 5. AMENDMENT.** Section 43-43-06 of the 1985 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows:

43-43-06. Environmental health practitioner licensure fee administration fund. There shall be maintained in the state treasury a special fund to be known as the environmental health practitioner licensure fee administrative fund. All money deposited or paid into this fund shall be continuously available to the secretary of state <u>health</u> <u>officer</u> for reimbursement to the advisory board, and shall not lapse at any time or be transferred to any other fund. The fund shall consist of any money collected by the secretary of state <u>health officer</u> in accordance with section 43-43-04.

SECTION 6. AMENDMENT. Section 43-43-07 of the 1985 Supplement to the North Dakota Century Code is hereby amended and reenacted to read as follows: 43-43-07. Denial, suspension, revocation of license. The secretary of state <u>health officer</u> may refuse to issue or renew a license or may suspend or revoke a license when the licensee or applicant for license has engaged in unprofessional conduct. Unprofessional conduct includes:

- Obtaining a license by means of fraud, misrepresentation, or concealment of material facts.
- Engaging in unprofessional conduct, as defined by the rules adopted by the secretary of state <u>health officer</u>, or violating the code of ethics adopted by the secretary of state <u>health officer</u>.
- 3. Conviction of an offense, as defined by section 12.1-01-04, determined by the secretary of state <u>health officer</u> to have a direct bearing on the person's ability to serve the public in the capacity of a licensed environmental health practitioner; or the secretary of state <u>health</u> <u>officer</u> determines that such applicant or licensee, following conviction of any offense, is not sufficiently rehabilitated under section 12.1-33-02.1.
- Violation of any order or rule adopted by the secretary ef state <u>health officer</u>.
- 5. Violation of this chapter.

The person may apply to the secretary of state <u>health</u> officer for reinstatement after one year from the date of revocation of a license. The secretary of state <u>health</u> officer may accept or reject an application for reinstatement, or may require conditions and an examination for reinstatement."
