57-39.2-03.3. Sales tax on sales through vending machines. Beginning July 1, 1969, gross receipts from the sale of tangible personal property costing sixteen cents or more sold through a coin-operated vending machine shall be subject to the sales tax imposed by chapter 57-39.2, and gross receipts from the sale of tangible personal property costing fifteen cents or less sold through a coin-operated vending machine shall be specifically exempted from the provisions of this chapter. The tax imposed by this section applies only to eighty percent of the gross receipts collected from coin-operated vending machines."

- 3. Multimember senate districts providing for two senators and four representatives are authorized only when a proposed single member senatorial district includes a federal facility or federal installation, containing over two-thirds of the population of the proposed single member senatorial district.
- Legislative districts and subdistricts shall be compact and of contiguous territory.
- 5. Legislative districts shall be as nearly equal in population as is practicable. Population deviation from district to district shall be kept at a minimum. The total population variance of all districts, and subdistricts if created, from the average district population may not exceed recognized constitutional limitations."
