### POINT OF PERSONAL PRIVILEGE

REP. MERTENS: Mr. Speaker: I rise on a point of personal privilege and request that my remarks be printed in the Journal.

Mr. Speaker, members of the assembly. This body should be aware that we are organizing under a change in the Constitution. Article IV, Section 12, of the Constitution states: "... Each house is the judge of the qualifications of its members, but election contests are subject to judicial review as provided by law..." This change took effect December 1, 1986. I think it was voted on by the people in the general election of 1984. In district five, the courts have been asked to review the contest. The final outcome of that election is still under the review of the courts. We do not question the qualifications of Mike Timm to be seated in this assembly. It is, however, our position that the seating of Mike Timm is provisional, pending the final outcome of the judicial review of the district five election. Thank you.

SPEAKER KRETSCHMAR: Mr. Speaker. Ladies and gentlemen of this Fifty-first Legislative Assembly in the House of Representatives: It is indeed a singular honor for me to have been elected by you as the Speaker for the 1989 session. I certainly thank each and every one of you with the most heartfelt thanks for this honor that you have given me. I know that it will be a difficult task, but with your help and certainly the help of Chief Clerk Gilbreath, we are going to get through the 1989 session.

Over these past eight sessions that I have served in this House, I have acquired a great deal of affection for this House, its members, and its traditions, and I hope to be its Speaker in the tradition of Reps. Kloubec, R. Hausauer, Kelly, Peterson, Wagner, and Solberg.

This session will be a different one for us, as all of them are different, but it will be especially different for me. I will sorely miss the discussion and the give-and-take of committee work, especially the Judiciary Committee on which I have served since I came.

I am your Speaker, but also your servant, and my office will always be open to all members of the House at any time. Of necessity, the Speaker has to make some hard choices. Not all of you are going to agree with my choices, but I hope you will bear with me because, in my judgment, all those choices will be in the best interests of the House of Representatives. I am a traditionalist and, for the most part, I want to maintain the traditions of the House of Representatives, and maybe on occasion I will want to start a new tradition or two.

One of the great American public figures of this century, Charles Evans Hughes, once said, and I paraphrase, that "no person is worthy of a public office unless ready to give it up immediately at any moment." That is indeed a sobering thought and I hope always to keep it in mind during my tenure as Speaker, as all of us should who serve in a governmental office.

No parliamentary body can work efficiently or get much done without a good set of rules. This House has, in the past, adopted a good set of rules and I believe they will do so again, and I admonish all of the members of the House to become thoroughly familiar with those rules because that is how the work of the House is done, by and through those rules.

I certainly look forward to having a good session. We will have to make some hard choices, but I am sure this Legislative Assembly, both this House and the Senate across the hall, will come up with the best solutions, for this time, for North Dakota and its people. We go into our second century with the Fifty-first Session and I think it will be a fine and a remarkable time. With that, let us get on with the work of the House. There will be a lot of it. Thank you very much.

Again, Mr. Speaker and members of the House, my first duty as your Speaker is indeed a pleasant one. I am to present the gavel used at the 1987 session to Speaker Dick Kloubec, and I might just read the inscription. "The gavel used by Richard Kloubec, Speaker, North Dakota House of Representatives, Fiftieth Legislative Session, 1987." I present it to a friend who did an excellent job.

REP. KLOUBEC: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. This is the old gavel. I wondered why this puny little thing did not make the noise that it should have when we called the House to order.

It has been a distinct and unique pleasure for me to serve as your Speaker in the last session. I endeavored to be fair and impartial and act to the best of my ability to conduct the business of the House in the best tradition of our former Speakers. It is with some reluctance, as I am sure all other Speakers have felt, to give up the office of Speaker, but that has been our tradition.

Being your speaker has been the highlight of my legislative career until now. To those of you who served in the Fiftieth Legislative Session, I appreciated the trust and confidence you placed in me. Thank you all.
