57-38-34.3. Optional contributions to nongame wildlife fund. On all tax returns under this chapter, a taxpayer may designate a contribution to the nongame wildlife fund of any amount of one dollar or more to be added to tax liability or deducted from any refund that would otherwise be payable by or to the taxpayer. No refunds may be made by the tax commissioner to any taxpayer unless the balance remaining to be refunded after any contribution designation is at least five dollars. On all state income tax returns the tax commissioner shall notify taxpayers of this optional contribution. The amount of these optional contributions must be transferred by the tax commissioner to the state treasurer for deposit in the nongame wildlife fund for use as provided in section 20.1-02-16.2."
