The board of county commissioners of any county, the governing body of any city or school district, a district health unit, or any combination thereof, which has elected to

participate in the North Dakota public employees retirement system, is hereby authorized may on behalf of its permanent employees, and permanent noncertified employees only in the case of school districts, to extend the benefits of the uniform group insurance program, as provided in this chapter, to such those employees. The boards of county commissioners of participating counties and the governing bodies of participating cities, or school districts, district health units, or any combinations thereof may determine the amount of the governing bodies' employee's monthly contribution towards toward the total monthly premium amount required of each eligible participating employee."
