REMARKS OF LIEUTENANT GOVERNOR LLOYD OMDAHL

During the interim, I appeared before the interim committee on the question of removing the Lieutenant Governor as the presiding officer of the Senate. As a political science professor, I have tended to be very conscious of separation of powers, but my support of that proposal was construed by some as a matter of

personal preference rather than some constitutional principle. I want to make it very clear to the Senate that I am very pleased to be your presiding officer and it has nothing to do with my choice of company. I wanted to assure the members of the Senate that I have my schedule cleared from now until the fifteenth of April and that I will enjoy your company for the next three or four months. I wanted you to be assured that my position on this has nothing to do with presiding personally.

ELECTION OF PRESIDENT PRO TEM

SEN. MATHERN: Mr. President. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate. On this momentous occasion I rise to nominate the man who has served this body since 1965. This man has served with honor and distinction as a member of the Political Subdivisions Committee, the Rules Committee, the Judiciary Committee, the Transportation Committee, the Joint Constitutional Revision Committee, and this last session, 1987, served as Chairman of the Judiciary Committee. The man that I am about to nominate has served the city of Fargo for twenty years as Mayor from 1954 to 1974. As you know, those years were tumultuous years in our cities. This man was elected over and over during those years which shows the confidence that the people placed in him and also shows the dedication that he provided to that office, an office that was funded half-time but was served by him on a full-time basis. This individual also served people individually. I know personally, as I work as a social worker, of his concern from his telephone calls for individuals when they needed service. He never apologized for asking for the service that individuals needed. He went beyond, too, looking for meeting the needs of individuals. He looked for ways of systemic change where discrimination, poverty, and prejudice could be eliminated. Ladies and gentlemen of the Senate, we live in a culture that essentially says we measure success most often by the amount of personal possessions and wealth

one can accumulate. I humbly and with respect nominate for this high office as President Pro Tem of the Senate a counterculture man, a man who has given and continues to give his life not to personal wealth, but to public service, the Honorable Herschel Lashkowitz of Fargo.

SEN. LODOEN: Mr. President, I would like to place in nomination the man that has served well of this body since being elected in 1974 and has a distinguished career in the Senate. He has served on the Appropriations Committee, the State and Federal and Agriculture Committees, he has been a past Chairman of the Agriculture Committee, and he represents his district well. He is from up in District 11 in Pembina County where they all love him very much, as do the rest of us, and I would like to place in nomination Senator Kent Vosper.
