# FIRST READING OF HOUSE CONCURRENT RESOLUTIONS

HCR 3069: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the feasibility and desirability of adopting an alternative method of delivery of special education and related services to developmentally disabled students in this state.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Education.

HCR 3076: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study motorboat license fees.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on Transportation.

HCR 3081: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study legislative employee compensation. Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Federal Government.

HCR 3082: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the feasibility and desirability of replacing county and city emergency management organizations with regional emergency management organizations and transferring responsibility for the state radio broadcasting system to the Adjutant General.

Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Federal Government.

HCR 3083: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the adequacy of property insurance coverage to replace state buildings. Was read the first time and referred to the Committee on State and Federal Government.
