WHEREAS, North Dakota military men and women and the military men and women of the other nations of the world have recently been placed in harm's way; and

WHEREAS, the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait is a violation of international law and the treatment of the Kuwaiti citizens involve human rights violations of the very worst kind; and

WHEREAS, all avenues of peaceful resolution of the conflict in the Persian Gulf should be explored and exhausted, including full involvement by the United Nations;

 $\mbox{NOW},$  THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE OF NORTH DAKOTA, THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES CONCURRING THEREIN:

That the Fifty-second Legislative Assembly expresses its full support for the military personnel serving in the Persian Gulf and fervently hopes that these men and women will soon be safely home in the company of family, friends, and loved ones; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Fifty-second Legislative Assembly condemns the Iraqi invasion of Kuwait and the continuing human rights violations committed on the Kuwaiti people; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Fifty-second Legislative Assembly urges the United States government and the United Nations that all options be considered and all means exhausted in seeking a peaceful resolution to the

conflict, and further resolved that if after all options are considered and all means exhausted in seeking a peaceful resolution to the conflict have failed the Fifty-second Legislative Assembly supports appropriate action by the United Nations and the President of the United States; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that copies of this resolution be forwarded by the Secretary of State to the President of the United States, the presiding officers of the United States House of Representatives and the United States Senate, the Secretary of Defense, the Secretary of State, and to each member of the North Dakota Congressional Delegation.

# RULES FOR DECORUM IN THE HOUSE CHAMBER

- 1. No food or beverages are permitted on the floor of the House when the House is convened.
- Smoking is not permitted in the House Chamber.
- Pictures, including video camera taping, are not permitted to be taken at any time, except by the press, house and caucus employees or designees.
- No one is permitted to sleep or rest in a prone position on the seats which line both sides of Memorial Hall between the House and Senate Chambers.
- When a Roll Call vote is taken, every member shall be in their seat and register their own vote. The Majority and Minority Leaders and their assistants are exempt from the provisions of this rule.
- During debate, members are to be attentive and quiet and the noise behind the rail shall be held to a minimum.
- No member shall have more than one guest seated with the member on the floor at any one time.
- No one is permitted to visit or lean over the back railing.
- The Sergeant-at-Arms shall clear the floor of the House Chamber in front of the railing of all persons except legislators, legislative guests, legislative employees, and members of the press, during the time period commencing thirty minutes before the House convenes on any legislative day until the House recesses for that calendar day.
- 10. Tour groups will not be allowed at the front desk area
- 11. Legislators and employees shall be suitably attired.
- When a Legislator is speaking, the Sergeant-at-Arms will not allow 12 quests to enter that Section.
- When the Speaker is putting the question, no member shall walk out of or across the floor of the House.
- When a member is speaking, no person shall pass between the person speaking and the Chair.
- A member desiring to speak shall rise and respectfully address the Speaker and shall remain in place before proceeding to speak until recognized by the Chair.
- Visitors sitting in lower tier of seats in House Balcony shall not 16. touch, lean over, place objects on or put their feet on brass railings.
- 17. While the House is convened, no person shall read newspapers or other large publications in an unfolded and conspicuous manner.
- All persons shall wear identification badges while in the House Chamber or in the employ of the House.
- Any member seeing a violation of these directives, or who has a 19. question or problem, should advise the Sergeant-at-Arms or an assistant as soon as possible.

20. All materials placed on desks must be authorized by a House member.
