Two and one half inches (6.35 centimeters) directly below those words there must be printed in letters one and one-half inches (3.0) centimeters) in height the name of the state agency owning or leasing the motor vehicle. The width of the display required by this section must be proportionate to the required height. The color of the lettering must be in clear and sharp contrast to the background. The state highway patrol and all peace officers of this state shall enforce this section display distinctive official number plates and window decals designed by the director that identify it as a state fleet vehicle. The state auditor, in the course of spot rhecking or verifying the inventory of any state agency, shall include in the auditor's report to the governor and the legislative assembly any instance of noncompliance with this section that comes to the auditor's attention. The above requirements do not apply to vehicles operated by the attorney general's office, the bureau of criminal investigation or game and fish department game wardens, the highway patrol, vehicles used for drivers education at state institutions or vehicles used principally in juvenile, parole, and placement service, selected cars or vehicles of the state penitentiary approved by the director of institutions, vehicles owned and operated by any entity located upon the international boundary line between the United States of America and Canada used and maintained as a memorial to commemorate the long-existing relationship of peace and good will between the people and the governments of the United States of America and Canada and to further international peace among the nations of the world; or to any truck owned by any state agency. A passenger motor vehicle bearing official plates must be in compliance with this section. The administrator of any state agency who uses or authorizes the use of a motor vehicle which is not marked as required by this section is guilty of a class B misdemeanor work. The state highway patrol and all peace officers of this state shall enforce this section."
