If a majority of the qualified electors voting on the question vote in favor of final offer resolution, the district may use final offer resolution until the question is again placed on the ballot by the school board, upon its own motion, or upon a filing with it of a petition signed by twenty percent of the qualified electors of the district as determined by the number of ballots cast at the last annual election of school board members of the district, and a majority of the qualified electors voting on the question reject the question. If initially a majority of the qualified electors voting on the question reject final offer resolution, it is unavailable to the district until the question is again placed on the ballot by the school board, upon its own motion, or upon a filing with it of a petition signed by twenty percent of the qualified electors of the district as determined by the number of ballots cast at the last annual election of school board members of the district, and a majority of the qualified electors voting on the question vote in favor of final offer resolution.
