ANNOUNCEMENT BY THE SPEAKER

THE CHIEF CLERK ANNOUNCED that the Governor's office delivered to the Speaker vetoed HB 1302, with the Governor's objections to same, at the hour of 12:16 p.m. on April 2, 1993.

COMMUNICATION FROM GOVERNOR EDWARD T. SCHAFER April 2, 1993

I am returning HB 1302, and regretfully must veto the same.

As you know, I vetoed SB 2446 that was similar legislation which permitted modest payments to members of local airport authorities. HB 1302 allows for similar payments not to exceed \$25.00 per day. Throughout my administration, I will remain vigilant with respect to the cost and the growth of government. That cost diverts funds from the private sector, which may actually impede the growth of our ecomony.

HB 1302 is permissive legislation, and places control at the local level - a principle with which I concur. Nonetheless, I have vetoed the bill with the following specific objections:

- The bill presents an innocuous opportunity to spend a substantial amount of local taxpayer funds. North Dakota has 103 libraries, all of which are served by board members that meet throughout the year. Given the inertia of government, and the likelihood of authorizing these payments, I can see this bill costing local taxpayers thousands of dollars in short order.
- 2. Again, I believe that legislation of this nature is a step in the wrong direction given the number of boards and commissions throughout North Dakota at both the state and local level. Clearly, a good argument exists for modest payments to the North Dakota citizens who give of their time and energies for public service, on the local library board, Airport Authority, Chamber of Commerce, etc., but where do we draw the line?
- 3. Public service gives rise to another objection I have with the bill, which is whether it is necessary. In other words, is it necessary for North Dakota to permit payment to citizens for their service on the various boards and commissions throughout the state? All of us can think of many organizations, committees, boards, and commissions that the good citizens of North Dakota serve throughout their lifetime because of a personal interest in the program, in honor of civic duty, or service to their community, state or country.

I believe that North Dakotans will continue to provide unselfish service to our local libraries and communities without the financial incentive contemplated by HB 1302. The unselfish example of the board member who serves without remuneration is the one I would hope we as North Dakotans will follow, rather than withholding that commitment for a small financial reward.

For these reasons, I regretfully must return HB 1302 to your chambers.

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE OF AMENDMENT:

DEPARTMENT 710 - SOIL CONSERVATION COMMITTEE

SENATE - This amendment removes funding added by the House for the Centennial Trees Commission operations as follows (Centennial Trees Commission is provided a separate appropriation):

The salaries and wages line item is increased by \$10,169 from the general fund to reflect Governor Sinner's salary increase recommendation for state employees.

The information services line item is increased by \$624 from the general fund to restore a portion of the funding reduced by the House. The funding level provided reflects information services rate reductions.

Funding from the general fund of \$57,840 added in the House for indirect cost allocation payments to the Office of Management and Budget is removed from the operating expenses line item because the agency will not be charged indirect costs during the 1993-95 biennium because it receives funding only from the general fund.

The operating expenses line item is increased by \$43,502 from the general fund for operating costs of the Soil Conservation Committee which would have been paid for from special funds relating to the Centennial Trees Commission.

In total, this amendment reduces funding for the Soil Conservation Committee by \$270,162, \$3,545 of which is from the general fund and \$266,617 from special funds.

DEPARTMENT 712 - CENTENNIAL TREES COMMISSION

SENATE - This amendment provides that the Centennial Trees Commission not be under the supervision of the Soil Conservation Committee and continue in existence until June 30, 2001. The amendment provides a separate appropriation for the Centennial Trees Commission as follows:

In comparison to the House funding for the Centennial Trees Commission, this amendment makes the following changes:

Federal funding of \$50,000 which is not expected to be received is removed including one FTE volunteer coordinator position relating to the America the Beautiful tree program.

Funding for salaries, wages, and benefits of \$105,368 is provided for one FTE director position of \$90,912 and for temporary salaries of \$14,456.

Funding for information services is increased by \$183 from special funds to restore a portion of the funding reduced by the House. The funding level provided reflects information services rate reductions.

The indirect cost allocation payments of \$12,430 are removed from the operating expenses line item.

Funding for grants of \$100,000 is removed.
