Sens. Redlin, Kelsh, Goetz and Reps. Cleary, Rydell, Soukup introduced:
SB 2266: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new subsection to section 39-06.1-06 and two new sections to chapter 39-21 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to the required use of safety belts in certain motor vehicles and providing for secondary enforcement; and to provide a penalty.

Was read the first time and referred to the Transportation Committee.

Sens. W. Stenehjem, Andrist, Holmberg and Reps. Froseth, Mutzenberger, Stenehjem introduced:

SB 2267: A BILL for an Act to create and enact a new section to chapter 44-04 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to open meetings and open records of committees, subcommittees, advisory committees, and similar groups.

Was read the first time and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

Sen. Lindgren and Rep. Rydell introduced:

SB 2268: A BILL for an Act to amend and reenact section 21-09-05 of the North Dakota Century Code, relating to validation of bonds issued by public bodies of the state prior to July 1, 1993.

Was read the first time and referred to the Finance and Taxation Committee.
