HCR 3055: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the structure and organization of the Division of Emergency Management and local emergency management organizations.

Was read the first time and referred to the Natural Resources Committee.

HCR 3056: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the feasibility and desirability of implementing a funding program for child care licensing reforms, child abuse prevention, and child injury prevention through the purchase of personalized motor vehicle license plates.

Was read the first time and referred to the Transportation Committee.

**HCR 3059:** A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study state laws affecting the relationship between local housing authorities and the North Dakota Housing Finance Agency.

Was read the first time and referred to the Finance and Taxation Committee.

HCR 3060: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study authorized investments of political subdivision funds.

Was read the first time and referred to the **Political Subdivisions** Committee.

HCR 3065: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study alternative administrative structures for forecasting state revenues. Was read the first time and referred to the Government and Veterans Affairs Committee.

HCR 3068: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study and evaluate the needs of the vision impaired with regard to moving the School for the Blind to Grafton and the feasibility and desirability of instituting a talking book program in this state.

Was read the first time and referred to the Education Committee.

HCR 3069: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the substantive criminal laws of North Dakota.

Was read the first time and referred to the Judiciary Committee.

HCR 3070: A concurrent resolution directing the Legislative Council to study the feasibility and desirability of removing the environmental health functions and responsibilities of the State Department of Health and Consolidated Laboratories from that department and establishing a department to handle all environmental functions and responsibilities.

Was read the first time and referred to the Transportation Committee.

The Senate stood adjourned pursuant to Senator Mathern's motion.
